SPEAKER: Chair recognizes Senator Stull.

SENATOR STULL: Mr. President and Members of the Legislature, I'd like to ask Senator Burbach a question.

SPEAKER: Senator Burbach, will you yield to the question?

SENATOR BURBACH: Certainly.

SENATOR STULL: Senator Burbach, we have a case here where you advertised a hearing on a bill and now you've struck all the material and come with new material. The question is, do you think the material in the new bill or the amendment is generally the same idea that you had the hearing on?

SENATOR BURBACH: This is right, Senator Stull. This spells out the counties by name rather than referring to them as by districts. This is a major portion of the change and the hearing was held on the substitute bill rather than on the original bill, but is very little changes, there is a committee change of adding Sarpy County to Douglas and Lancaster. If this will answer your question, Senator Stull, I would like to reply to Senator Syas.

SENATOR STULL: O.K., thank you.

SPEAKER: Senator Burbach.

SENATOR BURBACH: Senator Syas, this is in no way a connection to one man, one vote. It is a group of people who are an advisory capacity to the State Tax Commissioner in making recommendations as to what is necessary in valuation of property. If we talk about Norfolk, Columbus, North Platte, their problems are very, very similar to those of Omaha, Bellevue, or the City of Lincoln. This is not one group against another. It is not a, a, a lawmaking body, they are advisory. In the areas of Douglas County you also have some rural property that needs to be assessed and looked at. This committee, county officials, Tax Commissioner, and at the public hearings, no one could see where there was one man, one vote involved because it's a policy making body, advisory body, they are working on a common cause, not urban against rural by any means. They all have a problem whether its rural and urban in every one of the districts, Senator Syas.

SPEAKER: Any further discussion of the bill? Question is shall L.B. 19 as amended be advanced from general file to E&R initial. All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote no. Voting on the advancement of L.B. 19 from general file to E&R initial. Have you all voted? Once again, have you all voted? Clerk will record the vote.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 3 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER: The bill is advanced. Move to the general file consideration of L.B. 132. Clerk will read the title.

CLERK: Legislative Bill 132 introduced by the Committee of Revenue Interim, signed by Senator Burbach (read). There are committee amendments on the bill. Signed by Senator Burbach, Chairman.

SENATOR BURBACH: As the bill was introduced, there was no time limit on the collection of certain fees by the Tax Commissioner for the financing of the advisory committee which we just discussed a moment ago. The committee did put an
