General File to E & R Initial.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 3 nays--5 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER: The bill is advanced. Which brings up the General File to date of LB 137. Senator Warner's bill. Is Senator Warner in the chamber? Senator Warner, ready for consideration of your LB 137. The clerk will read the title.

CLERK: Read title. LB 137. There are no committee amendments, Mr. President.

SPEAKER: The chair recognizes--Senator Syas, what-no committee statement in your book. Check your neighbor. Stand by.

SENATOR SYAS: I think--I heard a lot of "nos" here, so maybe it isn't in any of them.

SPEAKER: Senator Barnett.

SENATOR BARNETT: Mr. President, members of the body, I think I heard this bill and I don't have a committee report either, but I can find out. I'll call over to Senator Chambers' office and find out if the Secretary has this report. I'm sure she had it ready. I don't know why it is not in my book either, Senator Syas. I agree with you, but I do know that we passed the bill on unanimously.

SPEAKER: Senator Warner, do you want to stand by with this bill until we get some more information here? Let's move on to the General File consideration of LB 38 while we are considering this. Senator Lewis' bill, but I don't know which one. Will the real Senator Lewis stand up?

CLERK: Read title. LB 38. There are no committee amendments, Mr. President, or other amendments.

SPEAKER: The chair recognizes, with pleasure, Senator Richard Lewis.

SENATOR RICHARD LEWIS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I move that LB 38 be advanced to E & R. This bill as presently worded presented some problems, especially in the smaller counties, where it says that immediately upon submitting a claim that the clerk shall pay these. This was a physical impossibility for the clerk to do the necessary bookwork and make the entries and pay these immediately. Some of the clerks established a cut-off date at the 20th of each month which met much
