

SENATOR GOODRICH: There are occasions, there are occasions when I would agree with you.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Well, I, would you on this one?

SENATOR GOODRICH: Not on this one, no.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Well, I can understand that but I still want the bill held over.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Well, I see no, absolutely no reason for it. It's such a simple bill that I'm sure you understand it as well as I do but I will agree to lay it over until tomorrow.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Well, I'll agree I understand it as well as you do but I don't think either one of us understand it.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Well, that's your opinion.

SPEAKER: Now, gentlemen.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Well, you just paid me the compliment. I only returned it. I'll agree to tomorrow, that'll be satisfactory.

SPEAKER: Are there objections to laying the bill over until tomorrow? There is no need for further discussion at this time. The question is, are there objections to laying the bill over until tomorrow. Are there any objections? Hearing none it is so ordered. The bill is laid over until tomorrow.

CLERK: A message from the Executive Office. (read)

SPEAKER: We will move to the general file consideration of L.B. 102, Senator Savage's bill. Before we have the Clerk read that, the Chair is pleased this morning to introduce to the body 9 high school students from Brownell Talbot from Omaha, Nebraska. They are from Senator Syas' district over there and they are seated in the north balcony. Their instructor is Diane Deshler and we're very pleased to have you visiting the Nebraska Unicameral Legislature this morning. The Clerk will proceed to read the title of L.B. 102.

CLERK: Legislative Bill 102 introduced by John Savage of the 10th district. (read). There are no committee amendments or other amendments.

SPEAKER: Chair recognizes Senator Savage.

SENATOR SAVAGE: Mr. President, there is an amendment now.

SPEAKER: Whoops. We have an amendment. O.K. Senator Savage can make his motion and then introduce and introductory remarks on the bill.

SENATOR SAVAGE: Mr. President and Members of the Legislature. This bill provides education to multi-handicapped children for whom education services are not available in his or her own district and to seek out whatever resources are available. This legislation would continue a pilot program authorized two years ago to provide for care and education to all multi-handicapped children at State expense. The program which is administered by the Nebraska Medical Center Children Rehabilitation Institute provides for diagnosis and evaluation of the child's disabilities and needs and development of medical and educational plans and management. A number of parents from all over the State told how the program answered a previously unmet need for their multi-handicapped children and explained
