CLERK: 29 ayes, 12 nays, 8 not voting Mr. President.

SPEAKER: The bill LB 112 has been placed on general file.

CLERK: Mr. President we have some Committee Reports (read).
No motion on the desk Mr. President.

SPEAKER: The Chair recognizes Senator Chambers, for what purpose do you rise Senator?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, a point of personal privilege.

SPEAKER: State your point.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I must say to the legislature that to some extent my confidence in this body has been restored. Thank you.

SPEAKER: The Chair recognizes Senator Stromer, for what purpose do you rise.

SENATOR STROMER: There is a motion on the desk Mr. President.

SPEAKER: Read the motion on the desk.

CLERK: Motion read.

SPEAKER: The Chair recognizes Senator Stromer.

SENATOR STROMER: Mr. President, I would ask the body to maybe concur with me on this request. These are both my bills, I would like to be on record in voting for them, I'm going to be leaving this noon, and will be gone for the rest of the week. So as a consequence I would like to at least have the courtesy of being able of having these bills read today and voted upon so that I could be on record for them.

SPEAKER: Is there any further need for discussion of Senator Stromer's motion. The Chair recognizes Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Why don't we amend the motion and read them all. We've got to read them sometime, let's read them now as any other time.

SPEAKER: Senator Stromer, do you object to amending your motion to read all the bills on suspended rules, read all the bills -

SENATOR STROMER: If it's okay with the other people, it's fine with me.

SPEAKER: Well let's see, let's test the water. Is there any further discussion on the motion, Senator Carpenter has proposed that we, that Senator Stromer amend it to include all the bills, is there any discussion or input on that proposal. Senator Stromer why don't you rephrase your motion to me then and we will try it?

SENATOR STROMER: I would so say that we would, move to suspend the rules to take up tomorrow's final reading today.

SPEAKER: The question is shall the rules be suspended and the bills that will be on final reading tomorrow be taken up today, all those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote no. The suspension of the rules obviously requires 30 votes. Have you all voted? The Clerk will record the votes.

CLERK: 32 ayes, no nays, on motion to suspend.

SPEAKER: Very good. The motion carries, the rules are suspended, we will take up the final reading of LB 9. Senator Duis for what purpose do you rise. Senator.
