CLERK: Read. There are no committee amendments.

SPEAKER: Senator Luedtke.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Mr. President, I move that LB 192 be advanced to E & R for review. Mr. President and members of the Legislature, LB 192 alters a bill which follows up on legislation passed in the last session of the Legislature dealing with the opportunity for Workmen's Comp Courts to use transcriptions when court reporters were not available and as a result of this the law, Section 48-182, with reference to stenographer does not quite cover the complete reference to a person who transcribes the record when a transcription or recorder is used in lieu of a court reporter. So this merely harmonizes this section with the law dealing with the use of transcription.

SPEAKER: Is there further discussion of the bill? Senator Keyes.

SENATOR KEYES: Yes, Senator Luedtke, on Page 6, would you explain why you changed it from forty to forty-nine dollars per week.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: On page what?

SENATOR KEYES: Page 6. We are on 193.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: 192.

SENATOR KEYES: Oh, 192. OK, thank you.

SPEAKER: Is there further discussion. If not, are you ready for the question. The question is shall the bill advance to E & R for review. All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote no. This requires 25 votes. Have you all voted? The clerk will record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, 23 not voting, Mr. President.

SPEAKER: Mr. Marsh, may I see you a moment. The next bill is LB 181. The clerk will read.

CLERK: Read title. LB 181. There are no committee amendments.

SPEAKER: The chair recognizes Senator Savage.

SENATOR SAVAGE: Mr. President, members of the body, this bill simply allows Nebraska based insurance companies to write various types of insurance which they are not allowed to now. For instance, the automobile insurance companies cannot write life and health and accident and Health and Life and Accident companies cannot write automobile insurance. It would allow them to have a packaged deal so I..there is no committee amendments so it came out of the committee on an unanimous vote and there was no open opposition to the bill. I move that it be advanced to E & R Initial.

SPEAKER: Is there any further discussion of the bill. The chair recognizes Senator Cal Carsten.

SENATOR CAL CARSTEN: Mr. President and members, I would like to ask Senator Savage a question, if I may.
