SPEAKER: The Chair recognizes Senator Keyes. He's passing, Senator Kime you turned off your light, do you want to be heard sir?

SENATOR KIME: Mr. Chairman, members of this body, I'll have to ruse to concur with Senator Schmit's bill, and his need for more of these men. I don't know if they need ten more men or three more in attorneys, but I know that they need some, they're going to have to use more men. I know from personal experience that you can't use the same man over and over, once they have worked in one area of the town, or one neighborhood, and they become recognized, then they are done. You've got to change them constantly, and I want to second Senator Schmit's request there for more men.

SPEAKER: The Chair recognizes Senator Nore. You're passing, very good. Senator Syas did you wish to be recognized, you're passing, very good, your light was on and just came off, very good. Any further discussion of LB 13? Senator Simpson did you wish to be heard?

SENATOR SIMPSON: Mr. President and members of the legislature, I have the opportunity last Thursday morning to hear the head of the drug division in our Lincoln Police Department talk, about the recent drug raids we've had in Lincoln and the amount of people who were picked up primarily in the area of pushers and his concern that they had the cooperation of the highway patrol, all the undercover work had been done by the patrol, I think that they are doing a good job, the thing we need to do is expand this so that we can do a good job in more areas and I would support Senator Schmit's bill.

SPEAKER: Is there any further discussion of Senator Schmit's bill? Senator Schmit do you care to close. Senator Schmit is now closing debate on LB 13.

SENATOR SCHMIT: I have no closing, Mr. Speaker, Mr. President, I just move the bill be advanced to E&R.

SPEAKER: The motion is to advance LB 13, all those in favor of advancing the bill will vote aye, all those opposed will vote no. Voting on the movement of LB 13 from general file to E&R initial, have you all voted? I'll wait for you Senator Kime, go ahead sir. Once again have you all voted? Voting on, the Clerk will record.

CLERK: 31 ayes, no nays, 18 not voting, Mr. President.

SPEAKER: The bill is advanced. Move this on I believe to the general file consideration of LB 101A.

CLERK: Title Read LB 101A. There are amendments Mr. President by Senator Schmit (read).

SPEAKER: The Chair recognizes Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Move the adoption of the amendments.

SPEAKER: Is there any further discussion of the amendments? The question is shall the amendments be adopted, all those in favor say aye, those opposed say no. So ordered the amendments are adopted.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President and members of the legislature, I hate to come back at you again after the last time, but I'm going to have to ask again for a bill. This bill provides the money for the examination for the physician's assistant program. It provides for the money to go into the general fund, there is a fee of \$75.00 per physician assistant, which adds up to I believe about eleven hundred dollars, the total cost to the
