

(Start Belt #9)

CLERK: Legislative Bill 227, introduced by Senator Luedtke, Chairman of the Judiciary Committee (read). There are no committee amendments or other amendments.

SPEAKER: Chair recognizes Senator Luedtke.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Mr. President, I move that L.B. 227 be advanced to E&R for -- Mr. President and Members of the Legislature, this is a bill which amends Section 76204 and 76241 which deal with the acknowledgment of deeds and such documents, Register of Deed's Office and in offices throughout the State of Nebraska. This particular bill merely states that anywhere in the statute, that you have reference to acknowledgment of deeds, this particular rule of acknowledgment will prevail. The way it originally was set up was it referred only to Section 76216 to 76236. As a matter of fact, there are a lot more sections in the statute, in fact, many, many more places in the statute that refer to acknowledgments of deeds. Therefore, those references, specific references, have been stricken and the wording is merely placed in lieu thereof by statute so that wherever this reference is, then acknowledgments will be carried out in the way and the manner provided in 76204 and 76241.

SPEAKER: Is there any further discussion of the bill? The question is, shall L.B. 227 be advanced from general file to E&R initial. All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Clerk will record the vote.

CLERK: 28 ayes, no nays, 21 not voting.

SPEAKER: L.B. 227 is advanced. We will move on to the general file consideration of Senator Burbach's L.B. 37.

CLERK: Mr. President, there is a request to insert an amendment in the Journal on L.B. 37 and lay the bill over until tomorrow, by Senator Carpenter.

SPEAKER: Are there objections? Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: The amendment is rather broad in its application. It deals with the entire commission and I think, out of all fairness, I think the amendment ought to be printed in the Journal so those who might be interested in this problem can read it and be better informed than probably would be now.

SPEAKER: Are there objections to printing the amendment in the Journal and laying the bill over for a day. Any objections? Hearing none, it is so ordered, the bill is laid over. The amendment will be printed. This brings up the general file consideration of L.B. 77. Senator Schmit's bill.

CLERK: Legislative Bill 77, introduced by Senator Schmit. (read). There are no committee amendments or other amendments.

SPEAKER: Chair recognizes Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. Chairman and Members of the Legislature. Again during my work with the Nebraska Highway Patrol, I visited with Colonel Krueger, Rowe (?), Oberg (?) and they informed me that in order for them to be properly staffed they would need 15 additional criminal investigators. These men are necessary to properly staff the whole crime labs and to assist the drug investigators in their work and subsequently, I had the bill drafted. It's before you. If there are any questions, I'd be glad to try to answer them.
