SPEAKER: The chair recognizes Senator Syas. We are still speaking on the Kelly amendment to the Lewis amendment.

SENATOR SYAS: Well, I am glad I do get to say something about the bill I introduced. I've never had so much trouble with a small bill in 22 years. I'm against the eight years and would love to have it ten. Now, if you want the eight years. Vote for the eight years and whoever votes for it, Senator Dickinson or Goodrich or any of the other Senators that want it other than ten years, please put your name on the bill, please, so I can withdraw mine.

SPEAKER: Senator Nore. We are still speaking on the Kelly amendment which changes it to eight years, as you know.

SENATOR NORE: Mr. President, I would like to ask Senator Goodrich a question if he would yield.

SPEAKER: Senator Goodrich, will you yield to a question?

SENATOR GOODRICH: I'll always yield to Senator Nore.

SENATOR NORE: Senator Goodrich, what is your occupation?

SENATOR GOODRICH: Real estate developer.

SENATOR NORE: Ok. You are a builder.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Yes.

SENATOR NORE: So this would be a rather lucrative thing for the builders, wouldn't it?

SENATOR GOODRICH: No, Senator Nore. You are about as far out in left field as you've ever been.

SENATOR NORE: No, absolutely not. This is going to...you can promote most anything under...if you take off the limit.

SPEAKER: Gentlemen, I would like to remind you that the only thing under discussion is the Kelly amendment at this time which changes, I believe, the term ten to eight and that's all that's under discussion at this time. Now, Senator Kelly, do you want to close on your amendment to the Frank Lewis amendment. Senator Kelly is now closing on his amendment on the Frank Lewis amendment to LB 197.

SENATOR KELLY: Mr. President, members of the body, please vote for this amendment.

SPEAKER: The question is shall the Kelly amendment be adopted. All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote no. You are voting on the Kelly amendment to the Frank Lewis amendment to LB 197 and the chair would ask if you have all voted. The clerk will record.

CLERK: Read.

SPEAKER: Senator Lewis. Senator Lewis is closing.
