CLERK: Mr. President I have a communications from the Executive Office.

SPEAKER: Read the communications.

CLERK: Communications read.

SPEAKER: May I speak to the Assistant Clerk for a moment? Well despite the short time that we have, the proper procedure would be to revert back to the general file to the discussion of LB 185, yest the Clerk has some reports to read in, Senator Chambers we are going back to you the debate on 185.

CLERK: Notice of committee hearing

SPEAKER: The Clerk has some business first.

CLERK: Notice of committee hearing (read). That's all Mr. President. Mr. President on LB 185, the bill was first considered on February 13th which was yesterday, the title was read, the bill was discussed, the committee amendment were adopted, the motion to indefinitely postpone was made by Senator Goodrich, that motion is still pending.

SPEAKER: Do we have any discussion, Senator Goodrich's motion to indefinitely postpone LB 185, when we ceased debate on this yesterday, Senator Cavanaugh was next to speak then Senator Dickinson, Stahmer, Fellman, Marsh, and that is the order that this Chair would recognize, Senator Cavanaugh do you care to continue the discussion of the motion to indefinitely postpone LB 185? Standing by is Senator Dickinson, then Stahmer, then Fellman. Senator Cavanaugh?

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Mr. Chairman, just a moment please.

SPEAKER: Yes sir.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: I yield to SenaterrGoodrich.

SPEAKER: Okay, the Chair recognizes Senator Goodrich.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Mr. Chairman we were discussing yesterday, a possibility of a motion to bracket this bill, in it's present form right now, until the other bill catches up, that was Senator Carpenter's motion and I have no objection to that, I was wondering what Senator Chambers would, his response to that.

SPEAKER: Senator Chambers do you care to respond?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: There is an expression about being between a rock and a hard place, they're are people who wanted to speak on Senator Goodrich's motion and I don't know what they have to say, so since he can withdraw his motion at any time he would choose, I don't want to say that I'm going to bracket it at this point, I'd like to hear what they have to say, unless they are going to yield to Senator Goodrich's withdrawal of his motion, then I'll have to say something on it.

SPEAKER: Well Senator Dickinson was next to be heard, then maybe we can go through these and find out. Senator Dickinson you've heard Senator Goodrich's proposal here, what is your response?

SENATOR DICKINSON: Well all I had to say yesterday, when I requested to speak, Mr. Speaker, was a question regarding the fiscal impact, is it, we have two figures there six point something
