SENATOR CARPENTER: All I..I'm a little bit jumpy about Public Power Districts.

SENATOR DUIS: I fully realize that and I'm very happy to hold the bill over and if you would like to visit about it why we will get the proper people.

SENATOR CARPENTER: The thing that bothers me is that is, and it may not be the right word, is that I'm...what your problem is that this extends to them other things which pertaining to rehabilitation, construction, reconstruction, repairs and extension. That's pretty broad language.

SENATOR DUIS: Yes, sir and if you so desire, well, I'll be more than happy to hold it over.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I wish you would. Thank you, Senator.

SENATOR DUIS: Thank you.

SPEAKER: Is it your desire, Senator Duis, to pass this over?

SENATOR DUIS: Yes, that's fine because I'd like to be sure that Senator Carpenter has his wish and we were able to determine this.

SPEAKER: Is there any objection to passing the bill over. If not, so ordered. LB 213. That's Senator Richendifer's bill. Is he here. Senator Richendifer is not...Senator Kremer.

SENATOR KREMER: Mr. Chairman, there is an amendment to the bill and I talked to Senator Richendifer and he asked consent to hold the bill over until he gets back. He is gone this morning.

SPEAKER: Is there any objection to passing over the bill? If not, it is so ordered. Next bill is LB 240. The clerk will read.

CLERK: Read title. LB 240. There are no committee amendments or other amendments pending.

SPEAKER: Senator Hasebroock.

SENATOR HASEBROOCK: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, this bill 240 is a bill that was requested by the Department of Motor Vehicles. The purpose of the bill is to streamline the procedure and eliminate unnecessary cost and reduce the work load in issuing certificates of approval of lights and glass used in motor vehicles which are sold in the state. Under the present law, it is necessary that an equipment manufacturer submit two samples of each piece of equipment to be approved along with a report for testing of each laboratory to the Department of Motor Vehicles. The Department merely examines the manufacturers report and if the report shows the equipment to be SAE standards, an approval is issued. A sample of lights and glass are not tested by this state. Under the provisions of this law, the Department of Motor Vehicles would be able to accept the approved reports of such equipment from the American Association of Motor Vehicle Administration Administrators in Washington, D.C. as the basis from which to approve the use of such equipment in the state of Nebraska. At the present time, 46 states have adopted this procedure and find it to be very adequate. The service of the American Association of Motor Vehicle Administrators is furnished at no charge to the state employing the use of such service. I move that the bill be advanced to E & R Initial.

SPEAKER: Is there any further discussion? If not, are you ready for the question? All those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote no. Have you all voted? This requires 25 votes. The clerk will record.
