

(Start of Belt #7)

This bill simply provides that such persons shall not be members of the Retirement System. I move that this bill be introduced.'

SPEAKER: Any discussion on the introduction of this bill? If not, all those in favor of the introduction vote aye. Those opposed vote no. The clerk will record.

CLERK: 30 ayes, no nays, 19 not voting, Mr. President.

SPEAKER: Senator Whitney.

SENATOR WHITNEY: Mr. President, I'd like to ask unanimous consent that a supplementary report on the financial condition of the major state Retirement systems in the state of Nebraska be put in the Journal. Now, I'd like to just say that presently we lack \$20,000,425 of being fully funded with reference to our Retirement systems. This means an invisible debt with reference to the state of Nebraska.

SPEAKER: Any objections to that being printed in the Journal? If not, it is so ordered. Mr. Clerk, you haven't read the titles to those bills, have you?

CLERK: Mr. President, the new bills are as follows:

SPEAKER: Is there anything further on the clerk's desk?

CLERK: Nothing, Mr. President.

SPEAKER: In that event, we are ready to go to General File. The first bill on General File is 201A. The clerk will read.

CLERK: That's a "A" bill, is it, Mr. President?

SPEAKER: Yes.

CLERK: Read title. 201A. Mr. President, this bill was first considered on February 15th, some amendments were offered by Senator Kime. The bill was then bracketed.

SPEAKER: Are there any committee amendments?

CLERK: No, it's an "A" bill.

SPEAKER: Oh, an "A" bill. Senator Kime.

SENATOR KIME: Mr. President, members of this body, I'd like to have this bracketed again until the 22nd.

SPEAKER: Is there any objections to unanimous consent to have this bracketed until when?

SENATOR KIME: The 22nd. Thursday.

SPEAKER: February the 22nd.

SENATOR KIME: Thursday morning.

SPEAKER: The chair hears no objection so it shall be bracketed.

CLERK: Where's Chambers? The next bill is Senator Chambers', Mr. President.

SPEAKER: The next bill is LB 184. Is Senator Chambers in the room? Has he been excused, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: No, he's around somewhere. Read title. LB 184. This
