(Start Belt #2)

SPEAKER: The Legislature will be in recess for a few moments until we can get the machine--the Legislature will come to order. Will the Senators please take their seats for final reading. The Chair recognizes Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President and Members of the Legislature, a point of personal privilege.

SPEAKER: State your point.

SENATOR WARNER: The, there has been prepared by our staff and some other help a brief analysis of each of the different State aid bills that have been introduced to date which will be distributed to you by the pages and if any of you wish to have additional copies to send somebody to get questions on the effects of them, this is fairly concise and explains their differences very simple and I, rather than have to initial all of them, I just announced it so that when you receive them you will know what the source is.

SPEAKER: We're ready for final reading. I'm waiting for two Senators to take their seats. The Clerk will read L.B. 70.

CLERK: Yes, Mr. President, Senator Duis asked to be excused.

SENATOR DUIS: For just a short while, Mr. President.

CLERK: Engross Legislative Bill No. 70. (read)

(Machine shut off)

SENATOR MOYLAN: Mr. Chairman and Members of the Body. There has been some confusion about this bill that really should have been passed in the last session. It has already died on the board; some confusion in the redrafting of it and inadvertently, I got the amendment in which should not have been authorized and I am asking that that amendment offered on February 9th in line 10 where the original bill had "may" stricken and "shall" put in, that it remain in that form. The shall shall remain in there instead of may. I ask unanimous consent, is that the procedure, to return it to select file?

SPEAKER: Senator Moylan, it will take 25 votes to return to select file. So you will have to move it.

CLERK: The motion, Mr. President, is moving to return 32 to select file for the specific amendment.

SPEAKER: Is there a second? It has been moved and seconded that L.B. 32 be returned to select file. Any discussion? If not, those in favor vote aye. Those opposed vote nay. Senator Whitney voting aye.

CLERK: Senator Whitney voting aye.

SPEAKER: Have you all voted? The Clerk will record the vote.

CLERK: 40 ayes, no nays, 9 not voting, Mr. President.

SPEAKER: The bill is returned to select file and now we shall proceed on final reading with L.B. 100. The Clerk will read.

CLERK: Engross Legislative Bill 100. Introduced by Senator Barnett of the 26th District. (read)

SPEAKER: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall the bill pass? Those in favor vote aye. Those opposed vote nay. Senator Whitney
