34 ayes, Mr. President.

SPEAKER: The bill is introduced.

CLERK: Mr. President, New bills on introduction and L.B. 497 introduced by the Agricultural Committee, signed by Senators Schmit, Rasmussen, Maresh, Kennedy and Kime. (read). Mr. President, Senator Waldron asked to be excused tomorrow, Friday and Monday.

SPEAKER: Are there any objections? If not, Senator Waldron will be excused. The Chair wishes to say that we have 29 freshmen students from Milford High School in our body today in the South Balcony. The teachers are Mrs. Julie Jantz, Marilyn Haines. We are very happy to have you here today.

CLERK: Mr. President, some committee reports (read) Mr. President, I ask unanimous consent to be excused on Friday. Signed, Senator Snyder.

SPEAKER: Are there any objections for Senator Snyder to be excused on Friday? If not, he will be excused.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have a motion to place L.B. 22, correction, 229 on general file notwithstanding the action of the committee. Signed Senator Carpenter. Do you want to lay that over, just lay it over then, Mr. President?

SPEAKER: Be laid over. Are there any other pending motions, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: None, Mr. President.

SPEAKER: We shall now take up L.B. 201A on general file. It was bracketed for today.

CLERK: Mr. President, the title to L.B. 201A, introduced by Senator Kime was read on February 15th and was re-read on February 20th, amendments offered by Senator Kime were adopted on February 19th and the bill was bracketed to the 20th. It was again considered on February 20th and bracketed to the 22nd.

SPEAKER: Senator Kime, did you wish to take up your bill?

SENATOR KIME: Mr. President, I move that 201A be advanced to E&R for initial. I think this has been discussed and debated fairly well. Agriculture Department was asking for approximately \$15,900 to implement this bill the first year. It's a necessary bill and I move that it be advanced to E&R for initial.

SPEAKER: Any further discussion? Question has been called for. Those in favor of advancing 201A to an E&R initial vote aye. Those opposed vote nay. Senator Whitney voting aye.

CLERK: Senator Whitney voting aye.

SPEAKER: Have you all voted? Clerk will record.

CLERK: 30 ayes, no nays, remainder not voting, Mr. President.

SPEAKER: Bill is advanced.

CLERK: Mr. President, we have a unanimous consent request to consider L.R. 11 next by Senator Rasmussen.

SPEAKER: Senator Rasmussen.
