CLERK: 27 ayes, 1 nay, 21 not voting, Mr. President.

SPEAKER: The bill is advanced. That brings up the General File consideration of LB 206.

CLERK: Read title. LB 206. There are committee amendments by Senator Kremer's Public Works Committee.

SPEAKER: The chair recognizes Senator Kennedy.

SENATOR KENNEDY: Mr. President, and fellow members, in the absence of Senator Kremer, I would propose that the committee amendments be adopted. The committee amendment mainly gives the change of wording from "shall" to "may" and the privileges on Page 13 after line 25 and that in turn does change the section from one Section 7 to 8. So, I would move that the committee amendments be adopted. No questions.

SPEAKER: Is there any further discussion of the amendments? The question is shall the amendments be adopted. All those in favor say aye. Those opposed say no. The amendments are adopted. Senator Kennedy, what is your pleasure.

SENATOR KENNEDY: Corrective measure and I would certainly move that the bill as amended be advanced to E & R. I would explain very briefly that this bill does do four things. On the one, there was a bond set that we figured was considerably too high and it's been set down at a lower rate so that it would cover only the amount of money handled by the Natural Resources. Then, that they might be contribute to being sponsors of the snagging bill. Also, that the collecting fee might be raised from  $\frac{1}{2}\%$  to  $1\%$  for the handling of the fees for the county and then that the surplus monies may be invested if they so desire. That are the four things in the bill. They are corrective measure we feel should be done. I would move that the bill be advanced to E & R as amended.

SPEAKER: And is there any further discussion of the bill? The question is shall LB 206 as amended be advanced from General File to E & R Initial. All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote no. Have you all voted? The clerk will record.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 0 nays, 20 not voting.

SPEAKER: The bill is advanced. That brings up the General File consideration of LB 224.

CLERK: Read title. LB 224.

Some of these records are simply in basement vaults being mildewed and they should be properly cared for. I move the advancement of LB 224 from General File to E & R Initial.
