is a new bill, Mr. President, 68A introduced by Senator Duis. Read. Mr. President, there are pending motions to place bills on General File notwithstanding the action of the committee. Mr. President, there is a motion by Senator Carpenter on LB 177. This is found on Page 528 of the Legislative Journal and the motion is to place LB 177 on General File notwithstanding the action of the committee.

SPEAKER: The chair recognizes Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Mr. President, this bill was indefinitely postponed in the Committee and after some consultation with some people on both sides of the same question, we have arrived at a compromise which I am sending to the clerk's desk. If you desire and if you will, raise the bill and put it on General File. It will follow that we will attempt to amend the bill with the amendment on the clerk's desk which as I understand, I've been told personally, is in full agreement with both sides of the same question. It only shows sometimes that people are inclined to be reasonable, you can work out a compromise where otherwise might have been somewhat impossible. So with that understanding in which both sides are in agreement on, they feel if amended by the amendment on the clerk's desk which I ask him to read, I'll make the motion we put it on General File notwithstanding the committee's action.

SPEAKER: The clerk will read the amendment.

CLERK: Read.

SPEAKER: Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Now, Mr. President, this is a copy exactly as I understand it from a similar law they have in Missouri on the same problem. It's my understanding that that bill has worked exceptionally well and because of its experience and because of the desire to cooperate and coordinate, I ask that the bill be put on General File with the understanding that it will be amended by the amendment the clerk just read, and with the further understanding everybody is in agreement on it outside of this body.

SPEAKER: Any further discussion of the motion? The question is shall LB 177 as explained by Senator Carpenter be placed on General File notwithstanding the action of the committee. All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote no. Have you all voted? The clerk will record.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays, 21 not voting, Mr. President.

SPEAKER: The bill is placed on General File.

CLERK: Now, Mr. President, we also have a motion by Senator Carpenter to place LB 229...Oh, I'm sorry, do you want that one or not?

SPEAKER: Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: We've had...leave that go until tomorrow morning.

CLERK: Mr. President, we have a motion by Senator Keyes to place LB 298 on General File notwithstanding the action of the committee.

SPEAKER: Senator Keyes, what is your pleasure on LB 298.

SENATOR KEYES: Mr. President, I have the utmost confidence in the Agriculture Committee, but as they are not completely in accordance with the problems of commercial feedlots and farm feedlots in Sarpy county and I'd like to bring this bill before the Legislature and have a hearing on it, so I
