Now yesterday in the World Herald, I was quoted and it was quoted wrong, where they said I should take the Governor's bill and pass it over and let the Governor accept the responsibility, but I didn't say that, what I said was that we should take a bill on the floor of the legislature, amend it to what we think it should be, send it over to the Governor and the Governor will veto it, if he vetos it, he'll have to state his reasons for vetoing it, and then bring another bill out and start it across that the Governor's veto worked into it, the things he has -

SPEAKER: I was going to call for a point of order, because you cannot discuss a bill -

SENATOR KEYES: I'm not discussing a bill, I'm simply discussing a policy and I would ask if this is wrong then a lot of things that are said on the floor of this legislature, are wrong.

SPEAKER: We shall now go to final reading. Will every Senator take their seats please. We have only one bill up for final reading this morning, it is LB 165. Will the Clerk read please.

CLERK: Title Read LB 165.

SPEAKER: I declare the bill passed. Are there any resolutions Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: None Mr. President.

SPEAKER: Are there any new bills pending.

CLERK: Yes. Title Read LB 505. Now Mr. President we have a motion to introduce three bills. I move that the rules be suspended and that the attached three bills be introduced, signed Senator Waldron.

SPEAKER: The Chair recognizes Senator Waldron.

SENATOR WALDRON: Mr. President, members of the legislature, this first bill, well I don't know if this is the first one, but one of the bills provide that the Mexican-American commission shall meet monthly and the members shall receive a per diem of thirty five dollars for each meeting day. We've did this for other commissions and miscellaneous subjects committee felt that we should do this also for the Mexican-American commission. Then the second bill would change from fifteen days to thirty days the time given to a party in a legal action to answer written interrogatories, presently it is felt by many attorneys that the fifteen days is too short in many cases where you have lengthy interrogatories and we would like to lengthen this to thirty days, so that's simply what this second bill does. The third bill would allow the city council and the planning commission of cities of the first class, second class and villages, to use as a guide the comprehensive development plan which has been approved by that city. This bill will allow the city planning commission and a city council more flexibility in zoning matters, this bill results as a court case that came out last year, in one of our district courts, which might prove to be a great hindrance to the city of this first class, second class and villages in the future.
