SPEAKER: Senator Syas, Senator Lewis had a new motion. We could not...can't have two motions on the floor at the same time and we presently have a motion before the house, and there have been no objections, so the chair will recognize Senator Waldron for closing on his motion to introduce five... a package of five bills.

SENATOR WALDRON: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I'd hope to...I'm sorry that we have generated some conversation here which doesn't seem to me to be entirely germane at this point, because the problem is that we introduce these bills. This is the first bill and I'm sure will be the last bill that the Miscellaneous Subjects Committee have asked this Legislature to introduce. We have tried to save them so they would all be together so that we would not be bothering you every day and they are primarily noncontroversial bills and we can hold the hearing on them the same day we hold hearings on other bills. We are not going to delay the process here. As I pointed out before, I am quite willing to adjourn any day, today or tomorrow, or any other day that Senator Syas, Senator Carstens, or anyone wants to, and let the rest of the business remain over for the following year. So, I would hope that we would introduce these so we can go on with our regular business today.

SPEAKER: Those in favor of introducing these five bills vote aye. Those opposed vote nay. It takes 30 votes. Senator Whitney voting aye.

CLERK: Senator Whitney voting aye.

SPEAKER: Have you all voted? The clerk...

SENATOR WALDRON: We need three now and if everybody would just vote. There is 18 not voting. I mean you can vote no, but it would be nice to see you vote. Now, we need one.

SPEAKER: The clerk will record the vote.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 4 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER: The bills have been introduced. The chair wishes to announce that there is 17 Junior High School students in the south balcony. Robin Mickle Junior is the teacher. They are from the primary city of Lincoln, Nebraska. Senator Barnett, as their Senator. Senator Barnett wishes to...
