SENATOR SCHMIT: Members of the Legislature. SPEAKER: Any discussion on the motion to advance the bill? If not, all those in favor say aye. Those opposed no. The bill as amended is advanced. Now, Mr. Clerk, do you have any resolutions?

CLERK: Yes, Mr. President. Legislative Resolution No. 15. Introduced by Senator Anderson of the 37th district. (Resolution read).

SPEAKER: The resolution will be printed in the Journal and laid over. Any further business on the Clerk's desk?

CLERK: We have another one, Mr. President.
