

LB 515, 516
March 2, 1973

CLERK: 33 ayes, 3 nays and 13 not voting, Mr. President.

SPEAKER: The bill is introduced. The clerk will want to read the title to those two bills.

CLERK: Read title. LB 515.
Read title. LB 516.

SPEAKER: Are there other bills for introduction?

CLERK: None.

SPEAKER: We will move then to the consideration of bills on Select File. Senator Syas, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR SYAS: I just thought I might make a motion. I move that we suspend the Rules and introduce for the next ten days all the bills anyone wants to introduce. I think that will settle this whole thing. Everyday we come down here and we introduce more bills than we process. We're going to be here, of course you can't be here after we vote not to...to adjourn, but we vote to adjourn. But we...let's just settle this thing now how far we are going to go on the introduction of bills. This isn't the bill that broke the camel's back with me. Don't get that...don't be wrong. The other day when we put in five, that did it. Can I get a second.

SPEAKER: Senator Syas, the chair would point out that you can suspend the Rules for one day, but you can't suspend the Rules...the chair wouldn't accept your motion with the idea that you suspend the Rules for an indefinite period of time with the Legislature. You can suspend the Rules as far as this chair is concerned, unless you care to have me over-ridden, one day (inaudible)

SENATOR SYAS: All right, then what I would have to do is make a Rule change. Let's suspend them for today...well, that would be silly too. That wouldn't accomplish anything. So, I might have to have a Rule change, but I do want you Senators to think about it, that we are going crazy on the introducing bills. We are introducing more bills than we process.

SPEAKER: Then actually, Senator Syas, the chair is going to construe that you made a motion to suspend the Rules for the introduction of bills for today. That's the motion that I would accept now and if that's before us. That's your choice.

SENATOR SYAS: That's right. I might as well withdraw it because I understand from the chair there is no one...no more to introduce today. So, that would be kind of a silly vote.

SPEAKER: Well, we have some discussants anyway. Senator Luedtke, did you wish to be recognizes?

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Well, is there a motion to talk about?

SPEAKER: I understand there is a motion.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: All right. Then, Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I am not going to second that motion.

SPEAKER: I am sorry. If he withdrew it the chair didn't hear it. I thought you said you might just as well withdraw it, but...

SENATOR LUEDTKE: All right.

SPEAKER: He said there is still a motion before us.
