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SPEAKER: Motion is to advance L.B. 273. If you are in favor of the motion, please say aye. Those opposed say no. It is so ordered, the ayes have it, the bill is advanced.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Mr. President, I move the adoption of the E&R amendments to L.B. 232.

SPEAKER: Motion is to adopt the amendments to L.B. 232. All those in favor of the motion, please say aye. Those opposed say no. Amendments are adopted.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Mr. President, I move L.B. 232 as amended be advanced to E&R for Engrossment.

SPEAKER: And now the final motion is to advance L.B. 232 as amended. All those in favor of advancing the bill, please say aye. Those opposed say no. It is so ordered, the bill as amended is advanced. Thank you Senator Cavanaugh. Do we have any motions on the desk for reconsideration?

CLERK: Mr. President, we have pending a motion by Senator Carpenter (read).

SPEAKER: Chair recognizes Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: You will remember the discussion when the bill was indefinitely postponed, I think it was last Friday, an amendment was placed on there in order to restrict the educational units in the area of buying supplies for themselves collectively and letting them benefit from the reduced price they apparently get from such activity. I have contacted -- I have contacted Senator Anderson yesterday and gave him a copy of this amendment. I asked him to contact others who felt like he did. I also put on each member's desk a copy of the amendment which we're attempting to raise the bill in order to amend the bill in order to attempt to pass it with the amendment adopted. Now what the amendment says is this; any equipment purchased or lease purchased under the authority of this section, shall not be resold to any governmental subdivision other than a school district unless it is no longer functional, so that puts the bill back where it was prior to the amendment. I, I would hope the body would reconsider and put the bill on final reading for this amendment because I think it's a quite important bill and I so move.

SPEAKER: Is there any further discussion of the motion? Any further discussion? Will the Clerk please read the motion again?

CLERK: The motion pending is in the Journal, Mr. President, (read).

SPEAKER: All right. Chair recognizes Senator Stull.

SENATOR STULL: Mr. President and Members of the Legislature. I'd like to ask Senator Carpenter a question on 197 if it's okay with Senator Carpenter?

SPEAKER: Senator Carpenter, will you yield to a question?

SENATOR STULL: Senator Carpenter, I wish you would explain Section 4 of L.B. 197. I think this is part of the bill that a lot of people objected to, including myself.

SENATOR CARPENTER: It gives to the University the same authority we give to the public schools and the educational units, to lease equipment, building or land.
