CLERK: Read

SPEAKER: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is shall the bill pass. All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote no. You are voting on the final passage of LB 12. Have you all voted? Once again, have you all voted? The clerk will record.

CLERK: Vote read. 21 ayes....

SPEAKER: Just a second, please. Senator Carpenter, for what purpose...

SENATOR CARPENTER: Voting aye.

SPEAKER: Senator Carpenter voting aye. Pardon me. Senator Savage voting no.

CLERK: 22 ayes, 24 nays, 3 not voting.

SPEAKER: The bill, LB 12, fails on Final Reading. Do we have any Resolutions on the desk.

CLERK: Yes. Mr. President. Legislative Resolution 18. Read. The Resolution, Mr. President, is signed by all members.

SPEAKER: The Resolution will be laid over. Do we have other Resolutions on the desk?

CLERK: None, Mr. President.

SPEAKER: Do we have any bills for introduction?

CLERK: None.

SPEAKER: Then we are down to the consideration of bills on Select File. The chair recognizes Senator Cavanaugh.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Mr. President, I move the adoption of the E & R amendments to LB 194.

SPEAKER: The motion is to adopt the amendments to LB 194. All those in favor of the motion say aye. Those opposed say no. So ordered. The amendments are adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, there is now another amendment. An amendment offered by Senator Barnett. Read.

SPEAKER: Is Senator Barnett in the chamber? Senator Barnett, we are on your amendment to LB 194, unanimous consent motion.

CLERK: The amendment simply reads, "to eliminate "counties between 100,000 and 300,000 population that have an Air Pollution Control Advisory Board".

SENATOR BARNETT: Mr. President, I didn't hear Senator Syas, but I move for the adoption.

SPEAKER: It's a unanimous consent motion here and actually the question is if he objects. Why that's it.

SENATOR BARNETT: OK, then, I so move.

SPEAKER: Senator Syas.

SENATOR SYAS: I might even consent to it if I hear some reasoning, but just to stand up here and just say that and that's all with no reasoning why....

SPEAKER: All right.

SENATOR BARNETT: I didn't hear what you said, Senator Syas,
