Clerk: 35 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President on the motion to suspend the rules.

SPEAKER: The rules are suspended and the Bills are introduced.

CLERK: All right. Mr. President LB 532, introduced by the Education Committee (READ) LB 533 introduced by the Education Committee (READ) Mr. President I move for the introduction of the attached Bill, signed Senator Burbach, its signed by the members of the Revenue Committee. Its a Bill relating to taxation, provide exemption from taxation of good toward and transit for shipment and bonded and licensed storage areas.

SPEAKER: Chair recognizes Senator Burbach.

BURBACH: Mr. Chairman, am I to move for a suspension of the rules?

SPEAKER: Thats correct sir.

BURBACH: I move the suspension of the rules, Mr. Chairman, for the introduction of a Bill. Well this Bill, that have, that the Revenue Committee is asking for introduction and if you'll note, all 8 members of the committee did sign the Bill. It is of grave importance to the State. The reason the emergency arises, because in January, the Supreme Court knocked out by a ruling, knocked out a portion of our Free-port Law here in the State. In 1960, 1959 as it, through the deliberations of this body, a Constitutional Amendment was placed on the ballot and in 1961, Legislation was enacted and then again in 1965 corrections were made and now in 1973, the Supreme Court found error in the grammar or the composition of that Legislation. To avoid another series of Amendments or changes, it took quite some time to determine exactly the correct language necessary for a good Free-port Law. I believe this is possibly the third draft of the Legislation. We have finished preliminary drafts. We have conferred, consulted with the Railway Commission, or the Public Services Commission and leaned on them for their advice with the advice of their attorneys and other attorneys, and I believe we have a Bill worthy of introduction and to accomplish those things that are necessary to get Free-port Law, and I move for the suspension of the rules.

SPEAKER: Any further discussion of the motion? Senator Burbach do you have any closing?

BURBACH: No, I think thats all.

SPEAKER: Very good. The question is shall the rules be suspended and the Bills introduced. All those in favor will vote aye, all those opposed vote no. Senator Burbach is asking for a suspension of the rules for the introduction of the Bill, which he just explained. Have you all voted? Clerk will record.

CLERK: 37 ayes, Mr. President and a motion introduced.

SPEAKER: The rules are suspended, the Bill is introduced, the clerk will read the title.

CLERK: READ. Mr President we have a reference committee report referring LB

SPEAKER: Read your report.

CLERK: READ. Mr. President I ask unanimous consent to bracket LB 206 indefinitely on final reading, signed Senator Kennedy.
