I ask for unanimous consent to do that and let me call the shots when everybody is here, or at least 48 or so.

SPEAKER: Senator Syas is asking unanimous consent to bracket 232 on final reading until you unbracket it.

SENATOR SYAS: Well until we get enough here, it's got to have forty votes and there is five absent right now.

SPEAKER: Are there objections to bracketing 232?

SENATOR SYAS: They may show up, and then I'll take it up, if they show up.

SPEAKER: Right. Are there objections to bracketing the bill at this time? Hearing none, so ordered. Once again if we can clear the floor and get the Senators in their seats, we could begin final reading, first bill on final reading is 102. Senator Nore for what purpose do you wish to be recognized?

SENATOR NORE: Mr. President and fellow members, I'd like to say that I had nothing to do with the newspaper that was placed on your desk, and it was a surprise to me and I don't particularly like the idea.

SPEAKER: Senator Hasebroock for what purpose do you rise?
