SENATOR CARPENTER: I contacted these gentlemen, and their in agreement at least I think they are, at to this motion, to pass the Bill and put in on General File for Monday.

PRESIDENT: Are there objections to bracketing the bill, as outlined by Senator Carpenter's motion? Any objections? Hearing none, so ordered. Senator Burbach did you object?

SENATOR BURBACH: (Mic. off.) of one Bill, 523, will this interfere in any way? To this veto.

UNIDENTIFIED: A Mr. President, on that point, a 523 was not bracketed to Monday as such. It was bracketed for 5 days after its' introduction. That's a little misleading but we bracketed it simply to under the rules as to be bracketed when it goes directly to General File for 5 days.

SENATOR BURBACH: Well, then these Bills that Senator Carpenter had, they would have precedence over,

UNIDENTIFIED: Yea, 5 to the bottom of General File.

PRESIDENT: All right so ordered. The Bills are bracketed. Thank-you Senator Burbach. Brings up to General File consideration then of LB 342, Senator Clark's Bill.

CLERK: Well that that's one of them that was bracketed.

PRESIDENT: Excuse me, that's right. Just didn't quite catch up with my figures here. 162, 228, Senator Luedtke's Bill.

CLERK: (READ BILL) There are Committee Amendments Mr. President by Senator Luedtke, Judiciary Committee.

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Luedtke.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Mr. President, I move the adoption of the Committee Amendments. Mr. President, members of the Legislature, the Committee Amendment on page 2, line 14 merely strikes reference to the court reporters salary for the, this this particular Bill deals with the separate juvenile courts of Lancaster and Douglas County which are the only places in the State of Nebraska where we have a separate juvenile courts, and we have a reference specifically to the court reporters salary, and it is unnecessary because section 24, 399, treats of the court reporters salary so that it be far better to straighten out our Legislation at this point by merely referring to the section which sets that salary. So the Amendment reads, to strike the specific salary and put it provided by Section 24-339, which now is that amount, but that's, that's the reason for the Amendment.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion of the Committee Amendments? All those in favor of the Committee Amendments please say aye, those opposed say no. So ordered. Committee Amendments are adopted. Senator Luedtke back to you.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: There is another Amendment.

CLERK: Mr. President, there is a further Amendment offered by Senator Luedtke, to provide that the Bill should become operative by on July 1, 73 and to add the emergency clause.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Mr. President, I move the adoption of the Amendment. This particular Amendment would make an operative date on this Bill, of July 1, 1973 and would provide for the emergency clause. We did this in consultation with the Fiscal Office, which felt that if we were going to pass this Bill, and do what we wanted to do in this Bill, it ought to be done so that the Fiscal year could begin and the Bill could be operative July 1, 1973. This would make all of our Fiscal statements a follow correctly and the salaries would be paid in line with all other
