PRESIDENT: Any further discussion of the amendment?
Question is, shall--Senator Cavanaugh, did you wish to be recognized on the amendment?

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Mr. President, could I have that amendment read, the exact language.

PRESIDENT: Yes, Clerk will read the amendment.

CLERK: O.K. Amendment read.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: O.K., then I'd have a question then for Senator Goodrich, particularly on professional personnel, what is that intended to include? It doesn't look to me, Senator Goodrich, like we've changed, changed the bill at all.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Yes we have. We have restricted it in this amendment to the upper echelon people, singular in the state college, the board of regents and the technical community colleges. All three of them are included and the words "other personnel" would have left it wide open. They could have hired a dishwasher, I suppose under that. Nobody would but then they could have. Now we have, by this amendment, restricted it to administrative, professional and managerial personnel which are the class, the line 1 and 2 or guess they refer to them as A and B, line personnel of any organization of higher education.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Well, Senator Goodrich, that would seem to include almost anybody in higher education except the dishwasher, to me. Who does it exclude other than maintenance people?

SENATOR GOODRICH: All the clerical, the maintenance, be, yeah, the maintenance, or the, anyone other than a supervisory personnel and this would be upper echelon supervisory personnel would be included but the rest of them would be excluded.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion of the amendment?

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Thank you, Senator Goodrich.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion of the Ca--Goodrich amendment? Question is, shall the amendment be adopted? All those in favor say aye. Those opposed say no. It is so ordered, the amendment is adopted. Senator Goodrich, we're back to you.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Mr. President, I move the bill be advanced to general file, advanced to E&R initial as amended.

PRESIDENT: Is there any further discussion of the bill? Question is, shall L.B. 248 as amended be advanced from general file to E&R initial. All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote no. Once again, have you all voted? Clerk will record.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 3 nays, remainder not voting, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: L.B. 248 is advanced. Do we have any other--

CLERK: Mr. President, I have a motion to adjourn.

PRESIDENT: All right. Is there any other business to come before the body?

CLERK: Nothing.

PRESIDENT: Senator Carpenter?
