PRESIDENT: Will the Legislature please come to order. We will have prayer by the Chaplain. Roll call. Clerk will record.

CLERK: Forum present, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Thank you, do we have corrections for the Journal?

CLERK: None, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Excellent. Any petitions or memorials?

CLERK: Read communications.

PRESIDENT: Do we have any notices of committee hearings or reports?

CLERK: Mr. President your enrollment clerk reports that she did on this day at 9:15 a.m. present to the Governor for his approval LB102, 112, 112A, 167 and 273. Read report. That is all Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Very good. The Chair has the privilege this morning of recognizing in the south balcony 59 junior high students from Crete Junior High School. They are from Senator Maresh's district. Their instructor is Mr. John Clabaugh and were delighted to have you today as guests and visitors to the Nebraska Unicameral Legislature. We hope that you enjoy your visit to the capital city and also to this magnificent building which still ranks as one of the 10 most magnificent buildings in the world. Likewise seated under the south balcony is Mr. Willard M. Wilson of Titusville, Florida and he is formerly of Holdrege, Nebraska and he represented Nebraska's 36th district here in the Legislature in 1949. Now if Mr. Wilson will step out from under the south balcony, the school students from Crete will stand up the Legislature would like to recognize all of you. Mr. Wilson you have undoubtedly discovered that we don't have any better control of the weather now than when you left. We do have two bills on final reading this morning. Well, how come? We have just one bill in Final Reading this morning LB 194, so we should clear the floor and get the Senators in their seats we will take up at least the Final Reading of that particular bill. Attention please Final Reading of LB194.

CLERK: Motion on the desk Mr. President. Read.

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Barnett.

SENATOR BARNETT: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I move to strike the enactment clause. The purpose being as I sent your letter this morning from the Lincoln-Lancaster County Health Department with one area underlined which I think is vitally important in this bill. These uncontrolled areas immediately surrounding urban areas, substantially destroy control efforts inside the urban areas because of the unique characteristics of air pollution. This is bad from a control standpoint and equally bad because of the inequities to industry within the urban areas. I didn't explain two things. I have a whole list of letters from the presiding officer for the air pollution control advisory board in Lancaster County. This is not only true, if I can hold up a little map that he sent to me, it is not true just in Lancaster County or for the city of Lincoln. But it also includes 4 other counties, 4 other small villages in the county of Lancaster, Davey, Waverly, Hickman, Firth and all of these
