CHAPLAIN: Prayer read.

PRESIDENT: Roll call.

CLERK: Senator Fellman asked to be excused Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: I didn't hear, who?

CLERK: Senator Fellman.

PRESIDENT: Fellman. Any objections to Senator Fellman's absence. Hearing none, so ordered. Have you all indicated your presence? The Clerk will record.

CLERK: Quorum present Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Are there corrections for the journal?

CLERK: None, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Excellent, are there any corrections from the floor? Hearing none, the journal will stand as correct. Are there any notices of Committee Hearings or Reports?

CLERK: Mr. President, we have a communications from the Attorney General's office, dated March 20th, 1973, addressed to E. Thome Johnson. (read). Mr. President I ask unanimous consent to bracket 43 on E&R for final, signed Senator Stull.

PRESIDENT: 43?

CLERK: Yeah.

PRESIDENT: Are there objections to bracketing LB 43 on E&R final, any objections to bracketing 43? Hearing none, so ordered.

CLERK: Mr. President your enrolling Clerk reports that she on this day at 8:25 presented to the Governor for his approval the following legislative bills, 194 and 232, signed Barbara Jackson, Enrolling Clerk. Mr. President Committee Hearings (read).

PRESIDENT: Senator Wiltse, did you wish to be recognized?

CLERK: Senator Wiltse asks to be excused Thursday and possibly Friday.

PRESIDENT: Are there any objections? Hearing none, so ordered. The Chair is in possession of information this morning that indicates that seated back there with Senator Dickinson is his daughter, Mrs. Nancy Cerone, we are delighted to have her here today, and particularly to help me keep an eye on that back row. Very good.

CLERK: Mr. President we have a couple of motions here pertaining to LB 146. The first is that I move that the E&R Chairman be instructed not to correlate LB 146 and LB 268, signed Senator Luedtke.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Luedtke.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Mr. President, members of the legislature, this is a technical motion brought about by the necessity of these two bills treating the same subject on the death penalty.
