shouldn't correlate them anyway, because, if 146 happens to pass, then of necessity you've wiped out those laws and you'd have to amend 268 as you're coming along anyway, so it really wouldn't make much difference, but if they move along together you can't correlate them, that's my point.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Okay, that answered my question.

PRESIDENT: We, are there any objections to unbracketing LB 146 on final reading? Hearing none, so ordered then, it's unbracketed. We have two bills on final reading this morning, and we will take up LB 447 first, it was scheduled for today, bracketed for today.

CLERK: Mr. President, we have a request to insert a statement from the Executive Board regarding the permanent full time employees of the legislature into the journal, signed by Senator Carpenter.

PRESIDENT: Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I ask permission to print it into the journal, and under the rules the actions of the Executive Board insofar as this error is concerned, have to be reviewed from time to time, and approved by this body, so tomorrow morning I'll make the motion to approve the actions of the Executive Board, I call your attention to reading the journal in order to better understand what the board has done for this body.

PRESIDENT: But you are still asking that this be printed in the journal, right.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Yes, so the membership could have it.

PRESIDENT: So ordered. First bill on final reading this morning will be LB 447, once again if we can get the Senators in their seats.

CLERK: Mr. President we have a report from the Miscellaneous Subject Committee (read).

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Senator Marvel, I feel like I have to ask you to take your seat, we are going to take up final reading here on 447. I could observe that there are times when the Chair sort of feels like it's like keeping school, and attention please the final reading of LB 447.

CLERK: Title read LB 447.
