believed a no fault bill probably should be advanced, but that particular bill should be a benefit to the people to the state of Nebraska, giving regard to them and not trying to favor either the insurance industry or the bar people. Now I did that in all sincerity. Now I would suggest this Senator Waldron, that if we vote to advance this bill that we also vote to advance LB 153, I'm in accord with Senator Snyder, because I think both of them probably, if one has a look the other one should too. Now the thing I want you to do, if you will do this for me, if we advance these bills to general file and you are going to bracket them, would you please have the insurance industry and the news media convey to the people that these are not no fault bills, that there is fault in the 161 because they allow subrogation of one insurance company against another, and that establishes fault. So I would, I don't want to fool the people in any way at all, the other thing is this, I also want you to tell the people very definitely and the press tell the people that these are one of these bills, or your bill 161 contains any remuneration for property damage, this is only for the matter of bodily injury. I thank you for that if you will do it.

PRESIDENT: The Chair next recognizes Senator Stahmer, then Nore, then Stromer, then Proud.

SENATOR STAHMER: Mr. President and members of the body, I first of all like to ask for a ruling, does, in this situation would the committee amendments be on the bill or not, or could the Clerk like to illuminate us on that?

PRESIDENT: It would be the Chair's understanding that the bill would be advanced, the bill would be placed on general file notwithstanding the action of the committee, but that doesn't involve the committee amendments. The Committee Amendments would have to be adopted later on, after it came up on general file for debate and the sponsor of the motion here, that the bill be immediately be bracketed anyway on general file, so that would be the condition at least the Chair would understand, unless the originator of the motion has something to the contrary.

SENATOR STAHMER: Well I would like to speak in favor of bringing the bill out and that is not to say I'm against the committee amendments, since I haven't had a chance to study them, and they well all might be good amendments, I do think that this is an important matter then we should have a bill up on the board and
