SENATOR LEWIS: Well Mr. President, members of the legislature, as I recall it the committee amendments are exactly the same as those proposed by Senator Skarda, and, it only makes more explicit then clear the meaning of certain products used in this industry, but I would move adoption of the committee amendments.

PRESIDENT: Is there further discussion of the committee amendments. All those in favor of adopting the committee amendments please say aye, those opposed say no. The committee amendments are adopted.

CLERK: Now Mr. President Senator Goodrich would ask unanimous consent to withdraw the amendment that he had previously offered to the bill.

PRESIDENT: Senator Goodrich asking unanimous consent to withdraw a motion he had previously offered, are there objections to the withdrawal of his amendment, hearing none, so ordered. The amendment is withdrawn.

CLERK: That's all on the bill Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I move the bill be advanced from general file to E&R. Now what this does, it only spells out and identify the various chemicals and things that can be used on the human body and not to treat disease and things of a like nature. I move the bill be advanced to E&R.

PRESIDENT: Is there further discussion of the bill? The question is shall LB 5 be advanced from general file to E&R initial, all those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote no. Have you all voted? The Clerk will record.

CLERK: 30 ayes, no nays 19 not voting Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced. That brings up LB 164, Senator Carpenter's bill.

CLERK: Title Read LB 164. There are very extensive amendments Mr. President offered by the Banking Committee I would assume, yes, offered by the Banking Committee, and then there is another amendment Mr. President offered by Senator Carpenter to the Banking Committee amendment, which reads as follows: (read).

SENATOR CARPENTER: Now Mr. President this is supposed to be a non controversial morning and I'm sure this would or could be controversial, so I ask unanimous consent to withdraw the amendment, and try it some later time.

PRESIDENT: To withdraw what sir.

SENATOR CARPENTER: The amendment I left pending.

PRESIDENT: Alright, Senator Carpenter is asking unanimous consent to withdraw his amendment to LB 164, which the Clerk just read, are there objections to Senator Carpenter withdrawing that amendment at this time. Hearing none, so ordered. The amendment is withdrawn, then we are back to the committee amendments to 164. Senator Carstens.

SENATOR CARSTENS: Mr. President, I move the committee amendment be adopted. Mr. President and members of the legislature, the amendments on this bill 164, are actually the bill, the blue co-, the green I guess it is, original bill is completely replaced by 164. Now originally 164 was introduced by Senator Carpenter, included a good many things some of which I don't recall, but among them were bank holding companies involving bank holding company matters and I think also, probably involving branch banking, although I'm not sure, but at any rate
