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campaign and there was a gap in the laws as to whether or not they could take drastic actions against such an insurance company. In the original bill and Senator Carstens did refer to the Real Estate Commission. I am sure he meant to refer to the Insurance Department. Was going to set the, in other words be the judge and jury, practically, and the Committee felt in the amendment that it should go through the Court and, consequently, that is the reason the amendment was made and the reason for the bill is to fill a gap in the law on the penalty of unauthorized insurance company.

PRESIDENT: Any more discussion for 425? The question is shall LB 425 as amended be advanced from General File to E & R Initial. All those in favor of the motion vote aye. All those opposed vote no. The chair would observe that.. thank you. The clerk will record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, 23 not voting.

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced. This brings up, I believe, LB 396. Senator Whitney's bill. Well, those are all Senator Nore's bills.

CLERK: They are covered.

PRESIDENT: Oh, somebody's going to take them. I'm sorry. I just assumed that he wasn't here, they would not be handled. The chair recognizes Speaker Proud.

SENATOR PROUD: Mr. President, we have a series of six bills, here. Now, I actually don't know, personally, whether they are controversial or not, but they were placed on General File without a public hearing. I discussed these bills with Senator Nore. He feels they are noncontroversial, and, if, in fact, they are I asked Senator Carpenter. I talked to him about them. Senator Carpenter said he would handle them. They are a series of bills which, I believe, all deal with the same subject matter. If there is any objection at all, we'll just pass them over but if they are truly noncontroversial, now might be a good time to take care of them.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Senator Carpenter. Speaker Proud has asked you to handle LB 412, 13, 29, and 30, and, I think, 35. The first one will be LB 412. The clerk read the title.

CLERK: No.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I move these pass to E & R. These bills as....

PRESIDENT: Senator Carpenter, wait. Just a minute. Let the clerk read the title...

CLERK: Read title. LB 412.

PRESIDENT: Are there amendments to them...

CLERK: None.

PRESIDENT: All right. Go ahead, Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: These bills were introduced by Senator Nore and I am presuming they were done by request of the people involved in the area of School Boards. They make corrections at the meeting dates and the formation of various things pertaining to public schools. Obviously, I am not an expert in this field and the bills were put on General File at my suggestion without a hearing because it seemed to me that a hearing would not develop anything beyond which the bill itself said. For example, 412, the part in new matter pertaining to the Class 6 schools which are high schools, as I understand it, and it sets forth the time and the dates and the things in which they meet and which they don't meet.
