SENATOR DUIS: I presume Senator Nore this is about like buying pigs, you know, it depends on what the market is and what you can get them for, and then resell them to a certain extent too.

SPEAKER: Senator Cavanaugh.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: I wonder if Senator Duis would yield to another question?

SENATOR DUIS: I will attempt to, Senator.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: I don't know if I followed all the amendments, did, Senator Duis, did you amend page 6, line 14, hold a bachelor's degree from a recognized college?

SENATOR DUIS: Yes sir, that's been taken out.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: That's been taken out entirely.

SENATOR DUIS: Yes sir.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Okay, thank you.

SPEAKER: Any further discussion? The motion is to advance the bill as amended, all those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote no. This bill requires 25 votes for advancement. Senator Chambers voting aye. The Clerk will record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 2 nays, 22 not voting.

SPEAKER: The bill as amended is advanced. LB 364, Senator Richard Lewis, I believe.

CLERK: Title Read LB 364. There are committee amendments by Senator Kremer's public works committee.

SPEAKER: Senator Kremer.

SENATOR KREMER: Mr. Chairman, the committee amendments actually clarify the language, this is a bill that clarifies the statutes relating to the relation of these directors and the amendments simply clarify the language with the exception of on page 4, of the bill, it provides that if there is a vacancy, following the primaries - perhaps I should yield to Senator Lewis, he informs me that a compromise has been worked out and there will be new amendments offered in lieu of the committee amendments, so I will yield to Senator Lewis.

SPEAKER: Senator Lewis.

SENATOR LEWIS: Mr. President, members of the legislature, I'm sorry that I didn't check this out with Senator Kremer, I did think he might be aware of it, but I would ask that the committee amendments be deleted, and I have a copy of a complete set of amendments on the Clerk's desk that were worked out by, it's amendments that were worked out with all representatives of the power companies and with the secretary of state.

CLERK: These amendments Mr. President are found on page 872 of the legislative journal.

SPEAKER: Well Senator Kremer is this agreeable with you if we go ahead with these amendments?
