

Well, Senator Kremer, is it agreeable with you if we go ahead with these amendments?

SENATOR KREMER: Well, it's agreeable with me. I was not aware that there was a substitute amendment so I certainly will yield--

SPEAKER: Now, Senator Lewis, are these amendments to the committee amendments or are they amendments to the bill?

SENATOR R. LEWIS: They are amendments to the bill. We asked that the committee amendments be stricken, because there were some objections from some of the power companies.

SPEAKER: Well, the Clerk advises me that a portion of these amendments anyway amend the committee amendments so I think we can go ahead unless there is some objection with your amendment, Senator Lewis.

CLERK: They don't amend the committee amendments, they strike the committee amendments--

SPEAKER: Your amendment, in other words, your amendment strikes the committee amendment then and inserts another amendment so let's proceed with your amendment and if it is adopted, the committee amendments will stand stricken and your amendment will replace it. Senator Lewis.

SENATOR R. LEWIS: I move that we adopt the amendment presently being offered to L.B. 364 in lieu of the committee amendments.

SPEAKER: All right. Will you explain those amendments.

SENATOR R. LEWIS: Yes. This bill provides for election of officers to public power districts. It defines the areas these directors represent. It provides for publishing a date to notify the people when the term expires and it further provides for a distribution of election expenses and this is where the problem arose between the various public power districts. This has now been resolved. The wording has been refined to their satisfaction and as far as I know there are no objections whatsoever. This meets the full accord of all interested people. Now, I think perhaps there might be another amendment being offered to this which I am going to object to. I move adoption of the amendments.

SPEAKER: It has been moved that the amendments be adopted. Is there any discussion on this? If not, are you ready for the question? All those in favor of adopting Senator Lewis' amendment, say aye. Those opposed no. Amendments are adopted. Now, Senator Lewis, wait a minute. Mr. Clerk, are there any further amendments?

CLERK: Yes. Now, Mr. President, there are amendments offered by Senator Richard Lewis to the bill, they're found on page 726 of the Legislative Journal.

SENATOR R. LEWIS: Mr. Clerk, I think those are the amendments that I have stricken, aren't they?

CLERK: They're what?

SENATOR R. LEWIS: These other, these later amendments replace those amendments that are published on 726, I believe.

CLERK: Oh, okay, then you should ask--

SPEAKER: He should ask to withdraw which amendments, Mr. Clerk?
