

CLERK: The ones on 726.

SPEAKER: All right, then, Senator Lewis, are you asking to withdraw the amendments on page 726 of the Journal?

SENATOR R. LEWIS: Yes, I would ask unanimous consent to withdraw the amendments on page 726 in the Journal.

SPEAKER: Is there any objection to that? If not, they're withdrawn. Now, Mr. Clerk, are there any further amendments?

CLERK: Mr. President, a move to amend the, well now, here's another amendment to the standing committee amendment offered by Senator Lewis. This is on page 726 of the Journal, those you'd probably withdraw also--

SENATOR R. LEWIS: Yes, yes they were all the same. Just on two sheets.

SPEAKER: Are you asking unanimous consent to withdraw those, Senator Lewis?

SENATOR R. LEWIS: Again I ask unanimous consent to withdraw those, yes.

SPEAKER: Are there any objections? It is so ordered. Any further amendments, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Okay, now, Mr. President, we have another amendment offered by Senator Carpenter to amend L.B. 364. This is printed in the Journal at page 840.

SENATOR R. LEWIS: Mr. President.

SPEAKER: Senator Lewis.

SENATOR R. LEWIS: I would object to this amendment. I've read it carefully. I have the opinion of several legal counsel. I do not feel that this is germane to the issue or to the bill itself and I have, I could read you the opinion of attorneys that I have consulted and they say that there is no way under the present sale of bonds that any power company can keep from levying enough to keep their payments current so I would object to this amendment.

SPEAKER: Well, Senator Carpenter isn't here for any discussion of his amendment. Does anybody feel we shouldn't go ahead with it? Senator Nore.

SENATOR NORE: Out of courtesy, let's wait until Carpenter is here.

SPEAKER: Senator Nore says he feels out of courtesy we should wait; however, that's up to the body. I presume Senator Carpenter has the further right to return the bill to general file for an amendment if he so desires out--

SENATOR NORE: I agree, he can add it on select file if he doesn't agree at this time.
