

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Dickinson.

SENATOR DICKINSON: Mr. President and Members of the body. Took me a little bit by surprise. I just walked in the door. I'm sorry I'm late this morning. This bill simply changes the time requirements for persons taking examination for insurance exams, one that has failed to pass two or more kinds of insurance exams shall be required to wait a minimum of 60 days. I think now it's at least 60 days the way the bill is worded. It also provides for an increase in the number of days from 15 to 30 which the Department of Insurance has allowed to inspect the State filing rate before it becomes effective. That's about all there is to this bill. It went through committee, I think, without any opposition. I move we advance the bill to E&R initial.

SPEAKER: Senator Syas, did you wish the floor? Then we're ready to advance the bill. Question's been called for. Those in favor of advancing L.B. 462, vote aye. Those opposed vote nay. Senator Whitney voting aye.

CLERK: Senator Whitney voting aye.

SPEAKER: Have you all voted? Takes 25 votes. Clerk will record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, no nays, 24 not voting.

SPEAKER: L.B. 462 has been advanced to E&R for review. Chair recognizes Senator Syas.

SENATOR SYAS: --rise to a point of information. Now just exactly what just happened there; I understand that there is going to be a lot of people absent the rest of the week. I'd certainly like this Legislature to get it's feet on the ground. Just what's going to happen? I have heard as high as 18, 20, I think we better find out if that's true. Have you any knowledge of that, anybody in the Chair or anybody in this Legislature? Well, I, I heard that Thursday and Friday. Well, how many going to be here tomorrow? I'm worried about today. We're not, we haven't got hardly anybody here today. Pardon, I can't hear you.

CLERK: We only have two persons excused for tomorrow.

SPEAKER: The next bill on general file is L.B. 87.

CLERK: Legislative Bill 87. Introduced by the Public Works Committee Interim Committee.

SPEAKER: Senator Kremer?

SENATOR KREMER: Mr. Chairman, we're asking that 87 be laid over because information is being, is being gotten by, well, in fact, this request was made by Arnold Ruhnke representing the county officials and he has sent out some letters to get some additional information and asked that the bill be laid over until, oh, for about a week. Let's say indefinitely and I'll bring it up next week.

SPEAKER: Is there any objections to Senator Kremer's unanimous consent motion that L.B. 87 be laid over for a week? Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Senator Kremer, because you were the Chairman of this committee and you were highly knowledgeable in the field of what we're talking about.
