CHAPLAIN: Prayer offered.

PRESIDENT: Roll call.

CLERK: Senator Fellman asked to be excused until he arrives, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Are there objections? Hearing none, so ordered. Have you all indicated your presence? Senator Burbach, will you punch in? Clerk will record.

CLERK: Quorum present, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Okay, it is so ordered, 275 is bracketed then on general file with the stipulation that they can unbracket that whenever they care to, next week sometime. Do we have notices of committee hearings or reports?

CLERK: Committee hearings read.

CLERK: That's all, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: We have one bill bracketed for final reading. How many Senators are present? Well, I would call your attention to the fact that we do have one bill on final reading and for that it requires clearing the floor, getting the Senators in their seats. It shouldn't take too long. We have just the one bill on final reading. All right. Attention please, the final reading of L.B. 360. Clerk will read the bill.

CLERK: Engross Legislative Bill 360. Introduced by Senator Warner of the 25th district. (Bill read)

PRESIDENT: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall the bill pass with the emergency clause attached? All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote no. It did, it lit up like a pinball machine. Free game, right. Have you all voted. That's got to be the best joke of the morning. Clerk will record.
