SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President and Members of the Legislature. If these bills are introduced, I hope they'll be spread out. I'm not saying this as a joke either and not have them all in one committee for hearing. They can wind up being technical or complex and they might require much closer scrutiny than one committee can give this late in the session so I would ask the Reference Committee, if the bills are introduced, not to put them all in the Government Committee and if you put any in the Government Committee, please don't put that two inch thick one there.

PRESIDENT: Very good. That's a reasonable request. Senator Syas, did you wish to be recognized again? All right. We'll move on--are there any other, do we have any other motions to advance, do we have motions to advance bills from committee. Senator Syas, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR SYAS: Well, the purpose I rise, not on what you been talking about. I, I know it's on Journals, I mean on resolutions that you do not put the committee report in the Journal and we have LR 19 and I think the committee report in this instance should go in the Journal because I think it explains why we amended the resolution and it'll be helpful to the Legislature. It's the committee report. Therefore, I think that, and I'm requesting that you put the committee report in the Journal just like you would a bill. Well, I'd like, I think it explains why we amended it.

PRESIDENT: You're asking to have the repo--committee report placed in the Journal on LR 19, right?

SENATOR SYAS: Yes.

PRESIDENT: Very good. So ordered. It will be done.

CLERK: Mr. President, I move for the introduction of the attached bill, signed Senator Kremer. Signed by the Public Works Committee (bill read).

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Kremer.

SENATOR KREMER: Mr. Chairman. I admit it takes a lot of courage to do this at this point. The amendment is on your desk. It's a very simple bill. It's really contained in L.B. 45 that is out. As you read the statement of intent, you will notice that the last paragraph says this; "the provision amending chapter 24 was originally intended to be in L.B. 45, but since all of L.B. 45 is new language and not on the mandatory bill, it was considered an amendment to chapter 24 would be in the form of a bill." Now this is necessary. We thought that it would not be proper to have it in L.B. 45 and I move for suspension of the rules and place it directly on general file because it is a part of L.B. 45, only comes in as a companion bill.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion of the bill? You have heard the explanation of the introduction of the bill and you've heard also the motion to request a suspension of the rules for the introduction of the bill and for it to be placed directly on general file. All those in favor of the motion, vote aye. All those opposed vote no. Senator Kremer is asking for suspension of the rules, his bill, that he explained, be placed on general file without a hearing. Chair understands it's a companion measure to something else, under the bill. Senator Kremer, what was the number? Was it 45? L.B. 45?

SENATOR KREMER: The rules of the road bill and it's out on general file and it actually was in the bill but the bill drafter says we do not open this chapter in L.B. 45 so it's necessary to come in as a separate bill.

PRESIDENT: All right.
