

SPEAKER: Senator Clark, will you yield?

SENATOR CLARK: Yes. The counties involved will pay for this, Senator Syas.

SENATOR SYAS: The county out of county funds (Inaudible) this.

SENATOR CLARK: Yes.

SENATOR SYAS: The county out of county funds will buy this for the appraised value...

SENATOR CLARK: Or \$1.00, whichever is greater.

SENATOR SYAS: All right. Of course, all right. Now, and this bill go into the state school fund, the money.

SENATOR CLARK: That's right.

SENATOR SYAS: Has sold thirty feet of school lands on..well, out of several sections. Thirty feet along the edge, is that what we are doing?

SENATOR CLARK: Thirty-three feet.

SENATOR SYAS: Thirty-three, then. In other words, the county is buying it for the appraised value.

SENATOR CLARK: Right. Now, the way you say that I don't think you understand what I'm talking about.

SENATOR SYAS: That's why I asked you.

SENATOR CLARK: Because there is no appraised value, for rental or for sale on the roads. They have no value, on the roads. That's the reason we put the \$1.00 in, whichever is greater.

SENATOR SYAS: Well, how..what are you going to compare it with, then.

SENATOR CLARK: Their own valuation. Their. We have appraisers.

SENATOR SYAS: Well, who has appraisers?

SENATOR CLARK: The Educational Lands and Funds.

SENATOR SYAS: Oh, they are going to appraise the thirty-three feet and say this is the price.

SENATOR CLARK: They already have appraised them, Senator Syas.

SENATOR SYAS: All right, but then they are going to say, also, it can't be less than a dollar.

SENATOR CLARK: Yes.

SENATOR SYAS: A dollar per what? Thirty-three feet or what?

SENATOR CLARK: \$1.00 per acre.

SENATOR SYAS: (Whistle) Not very much money.

SENATOR CLARK: Well, they have no value.

SENATOR SYAS: Yes, but if the appraisal gives it a value, it'd certainly be higher than that.

SENATOR CLARK: If they appraise it at value, they can forget it.
