SENATOR CARPENTER: That's all that's in there now?

SENATOR SNYDER: Yes, sir.

SENATOR CARPENTER: The bill said \$700-some thousand.

SENATOR SNYDER: Yes sir, as I explained, that was deleted by the committee amendment.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Now this comes out of general taxation?

SENATOR SNYDER: Yes, sir. Now, I'm somewhat at a loss here as to whether or not I need an A-bill.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion of the bill? The question is, shall LB 94 as amended be advanced from General File to E & R Initial? All those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote no. Voting on the advancement of LB 94. Have you all voted? Clerk will record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, no nays, 22 not voting.

PRESIDENT: Bill is advanced. That brings up General File discussion of LB 144.

CLERK: Mr. President, we have a motion to adjourn. I have a new bill to read in.

PRESIDENT: Very good. Read the bill in.

CLERK: Reads bill. That's all we have, Mr. President. I move we adjourn, signed Senator Hasebroock.

PRESIDENT: Is there any other business to come before the body? Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: There's a motion on the Clerk's desk. On LB 179.

CLERK: Mr. President, I move that LB 179 be unbracketed and be the first order of business on Wednesday, signed Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I so move, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Are there any objections to unbracketing the bill and making it the first order of business on Wednesday? Hearing none, so ordered.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Now, Mr. President, I'd like to have a minute. This bill pertains to Hiram Scott and the school in Beatrice. I'm going to move tomorrow to divide the question and I say tonight for you people who are opposed to the bill that if you can find anywhere in this bill pertaining to Hiram Scott or my district where we're trying to bail anybody out, if you can show me with any reasonable degree of accuracy, I'll withdraw the bill. This will give you until tomorrow to find that out, I don't want to catch you flat-footed.

PRESIDENT: We have a motion to adjourn until 9:00 tomorrow. Those in favor of the motion please signify by saying aye, those opposed say no. So ordered, we're adjourned until 9:00 tomorrow.
