SPEAKER: Senator Marvel.

SENATOR MARVEL: Well I, I was going to ask, a Senator Burbach the same question. Could I repeat what, I understand the Amendment to be and you correct me if I'm wrong. As I understand you would leave the commission the same. Consisting of,

SENATOR BURBACH: Correct.

SENATOR MARVEL: Governor, and the 4 Constitutional officers, they then would, would a, select 3 who would, one of whom would be appointed by the Governor. To be the Director of this new department. Right, that all right so far?

SENATOR BURBACH: Right.

SENATOR MARVEL: And then from the Department itself would be extracted the Data Processing Division, and that Data Processing Division, instead of being under the director who's finally appointed by the Governor, the this would be a separate division, and would be under the general jurisdiction of the 5 members commission. They would make the appointment as to the director of the Data Processing Division. Is that, what you had in mind? You want me to repeat my understanding of the last part?

SENATOR BURBACH: Would this help you if I'd say there shall also be a Data Processing Division which shall be directly responsible to the commission,

SENATOR MARVEL: Yes.

SENATOR BURBACH: And not a part of the Department of Governmental services.

SENATOR MARVEL: That's my understanding.

SENATOR BURBACH: Administrator of the Data Processing Division shall be appointed by the commission and shall serve at his pleasure.

SENATOR MARVEL: And the director who is finally selected by the Governors, confirmed by the Legislature, just as previously is that right? Ok.

SENATOR BURBACH: No, I don't believe that on, unless, I don't believe that provision is in here sir. A, it is not spelled out in this Amendment unless it is spelled out in 452. Do you recall that it is?

SENATOR MARVEL: I think it is, but I, that's a key point I kind of like to check, otherwise I think the Amendment is acceptable. You know as far as I'm concerned. I would agree to it, but I would like to check that one point, if I could.

SPEAKER: Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Well if it's acceptable to Senator Marvel, it's certainly acceptable to me, and I was going to ask a point of order which has no relevance now.

SPEAKER: Senator Duis.

SENATOR DUIS: Mr. President, if we're going to accept this Amendment I want, what has been said on the floor here just now, made a permanent part of the record. So that there is no doubt in anybody's mind later on as to the intent of this Legislation.
