SPEAKER: Senator Burbach.

SENATOR BURBACH: Mr. President and members of the legislature, this has been well discussed this morning, this is an attempt to make certain changes in Government, it is an attempt to do so, fairly and honestly, it is an honest attempt to compromise on LB 452 and the failure of the amendment the other day I think, this will provide a better service to the entire state and possibly to all branches of Government including the legislature. I would be hopeful that with your affirmative vote, we can bring 452 back and adopt this amendment at the proper time.

SPEAKER: The question is shall the bill be returned from final reading to select file for this specific amendment? If it is returned then, we will have to vote on the specific amendment. This requires 25 votes, so all those in favor of returning the bill for the specific amendment vote aye, those opposed vote no. The Clerk will record. Senator Frank Lewis voting aye, excuse me voting no.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 12 nays, 12 not voting on the motion to return.

SPEAKER: The bill is returned, Senator Burbach, can now move for the amendment.

SENATOR BURBACH: Mr. President I move for the adoption of the amendment which we discussed a moment ago on 452.

SPEAKER: Any further discussion? This requires 25 votes. All those in favor of the Burbach amendment vote aye, those opposed vote no. The Clerk will record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 12 nays, 12 not voting on motion to adopt.

SPEAKER: The amendment is adopted. Now a motion is in order to advance the bill as amended. Senator Marvel.

SENATOR MARVEL: I move the bill be advanced to E&R for engrossment.

SPEAKER: Is there any discussion, if not are you ready for the question? All those in favor of advancing the bill as amended say aye, those opposed no, the bill is advanced as amended.

CLERK: Mr. President we have some reports.

SPEAKER: The Clerk will read.

CLERK: Mr. President your committee on Enrollment Review (read). Mr. President your enrolling clerk reports (read). Mr. President I request to be excused Friday, Monday and Tuesday, signed Senator Frank Lewis.

SPEAKER: Any objections, so ordered.

CLERK: Mr. President had I been present I would have voted aye on LB 206, 336, 336A and 380. I would have voted to confirm the appointment of Dr. Jack Anderson as Director of Public Institutions, signed Senator Anderson. Mr. President two new bills, Title Read LB 570. Title Read LB 571. Mr. President I move for the introduction of the attached bill, signed Senator Carpenter, Chairman of the Executive Board (read).

SPEAKER: Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: This bill was brought about by the action of the executive council in order to bring about the obtaining of statutes then for the distribution. I move for the bill to be introduced.
