

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President and Members of the Legislature. I move the bill be advanced. This bill provides the funds for LB 235 the bill we discussed yesterday. The bill is being held now on final reading waiting for this bill to catch up, just one more A bill as far as I'm concerned. I move the bill be advanced to E&R.

SPEAKER: Any discussion? Senator Snyder.

SENATOR SNYDER: Will Senator Schmit yield to a question please?

SENATOR SCHMIT: I yield.

SENATOR SNYDER: Senator along with your motion to advance the bill, would you include that motion that it be bracketed on final reading with 235?

SENATOR SCHMIT: That's alright with me. Pardon me, just a moment, what time period, Senator Snyder?

SENATOR SNYDER: Well, let's just wait and take a look see.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Well why don't we just let the bill move up until it gets there and then--

SENATOR SNYDER: --take its normal course? Okay. Well, it be what, Mr. Clerk, Mr. Clerk, what'll be, 5, 5 to 10 days at least?

SENATOR SCHMIT: That'll get us some time.

SPEAKER: Any further discussion? Ready for the vote on the advancement. All those in--Senator Nore.

SENATOR NORE: Mr. President, I'd like to ask Senator Schmit a question if he'd yield. Where are we going to get the money?

SENATOR SCHMIT: Well, Senator Nore, I think Senator Carpenter has some ideas on that and I think they said there was about \$2,500,000 surplus in the Welfare Department. I have about three quarters of a million dollars surplus in the revenue that's raised under LB 76 that---with my barn door economics that comes out to about \$3,500,000 so it looks like we got enough money right now, Senator Nore.

SPEAKER: All those in favor of advancing the bill vote aye. Those opposed vote no. Requires 25 votes. Clerk will record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 3 nays, Mr. President on motion to advance.

SPEAKER: Bill is advanced. Senator Carpenter, are you ready now to take up your bill?

SENATOR CARPENTER: I think Senator Stull desires to speak.

SPEAKER: Senator Stull. Senator Stull, are you speaking on LB 179? Alright, we're reverting back where we broke off this noon on LB 179. I believe all amendments have been handled, haven't they, Mr. Clerk? There is another amendment. Now Senator Stull, do you want to wait for this amendment or--

SENATOR STULL: Is there an amendment up there?

SPEAKER: Amendment on the desk. We probably should handle it. Clerk will read.

CLERK: Amendment read.
