and the Community College system.

SENATOR CARPENTER: The original bill apparently was just the interim, I think this highly desirable, and it will do alot to relieve some of the problems we have.

SENATOR WARNER: The section that is amended is essentially what is the law that presently exists and has been pertinent to children of service men who have been killed in previous conflict, prior to the Viet Nam.

SPEAKER: The Chair recognizes Senator Marsh.

SENATOR MARSH: I would like to add just one word of explanation, that this includes only the children whose mother or father are still missing in action, or who are still prisoners of war. I move this be advanced to E&R initial.

SPEAKER: Any further discussion. If not those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote nay. Senator Whitney voting aye. Have you all voted? The Clerk will record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, no nays Mr. President, the remainder not voting.

SPEAKER: LB 307 advances to E&R for review. The next bill on general file is LB 370.

CLERK: Title Read LB 370. There are committee amendments Mr. President by Senator Warner's education committee.

SPEAKER: The Chair recognizes Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: I suggest we temporarily pass over this, there is a question on the amendment that we will clarify, you can go ahead with something else.

SPEAKER: Alright, Senator Warner has asked that we just pass over temporarily, we will then go to LB 399.

CLERK: Mr. President 399 is Senator Anderson's bill, but there is an amendment by Senator Waldron who is not here this week. I don't know what you want to do.

SPEAKER: Senator Anderson, what did you want to do? With 399, do you want to pass over it since Senator Waldron has an amendment?

SENATOR ANDERSON: If Senator Waldron's amendment is still on there, I would like to have it passed over until he can be here.

SPEAKER: Okay, then the next bill is LB 223.

CLERK: LB 475 --

SPEAKER: No, 223 -- wait a minute, I thought it was 223, oh excuse me, it's 47 --

CLERK: Title Read LB 475. There are no committee amendments or other amendments.

SPEAKER: The Chair recognizes Senator Dickinson.

SENATOR DICKINSON: Mr. President and members of the body, this bill does exactly what the Clerk just read it did, it was advanced from committee without a descending vote, there was no opposition to the bill, it allows school boards and their employees to be indemnified by the school district, either by buying insurance or the district itself covering whatever obligation may arise out of any claim an elected person or an employee if the district chooses to cover the employees. I move this bill be advanced to E&R initial.
