PRESIDENT: Any further discussion of the bill? The question is shall LB 475 be advanced from general file to E&R initial, all those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote no. Have you all voted? The Clerk will record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, no nays, 24 not voting.

PRESIDENT: Very good. That bring up the general file consideration LB 223.

CLERK: Title Read LB 223. There are extensive amendments by Senator Luedtke's Judiciary Committee, nineteen pages of them to be exact.

PRESIDENT: Alright, Senator Luedtke before you begin the explanation on those, the Chair would like the prerogative of introducing some other visitors, we really are very fortunate today, we have a number of very illustrious international visitors passing through Lincoln. Seated back up in the north balcony, is Mr. G. V. Shukala who is the first Secretary of Press and Information for the Embassy of India. We'd like to have him stand. He is accompanied by Dr. Y. Jin, who is back there, Mr. Jagin Call is his escort and also there is Mr. D. M. Shadery who is the president of the India association at the University of Nebraska. Would you help me welcome them with a hand of applause please. It just isn't often that we have a first secretary for Press and Information from an Embassy here and we are delighted to have you here, Mr. Shukala. Now then Senator Luedtke back to you for the extensive, --

SENATOR LUEDTKE: I would yield to Senator Kennedy I believe Senator Kennedy has a request.

PRESIDENT: Senator Kennedy.

SENATOR KENNEDY: Yes, Mr. President and fellow members, I would say that originally this bill when it was given in committee they seemed to be an understanding that they would be people brought together through the interim between now and next year and they would be studying this, there has been some amendments proposed and they are very extensive, and I think under the circumstances they would be adding another judge and so forth, and I think rather than go in to the detail the complete change of the bill that we should lay it over, at this time and as introducer I would like to ask for that. We could bracket it on general file, if that would be proper.

PRESIDENT: Very good.

SENATOR KENNEDY: I think rather than go in the extensive amendments, I'd like to do that as introducer.

PRESIDENT: Senator Kennedy is asking as introducer to bracket LB 223 on general file, are there objections to bracketing the bill? Hearing none, it is so ordered, 223 is bracketed on general file, move on to the general file consideration --

CLERK: Motion on the desk Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Read the motion.

CLERK: I move we adjourn until 10:00 Monday, signed Senator Proud, Speaker.

PRESIDENT: We have a motion to adjourn, is there any further business to come before the body?

CLERK: Oh yes, Mr. President one important item, LB 545 is set for Thursday April 12th, before the Miscellaneous Subjects Committee, signed Senator Cavanaugh, Vice Chairman.
