CLERK: Senator Fellman asked to be excused.

PRESIDENT: Are there objections? Hearing none, so ordered. Please indicate your presence. Have you all indicated your presence? Clerk will record. How many members do we have present?

CLERK: Quorum present, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Senator Burbach, are you here? We think we have that recorded. Thank you. Senator Marsh is here. Alright. We do have a quorum. Do we have any notices of committee hearings or reports?

CLERK: Mr. President, we have a report (read).

PRESIDENT: Beautiful. Any other committee reports?

CLERK: None.

PRESIDENT: Any reso--excuse me, are there--

CLERK: Nothing.

PRESIDENT: No--noth--no resolutions, no bills for introduction? Well, move to the consideration of bills on general file. Will the Assistant Clerk give us a reading on those first 6 that we passed this morning, any of those that we should take up this afternoon first thing? If not, we'll go on to the one right after 517 which would be 518. Alright. Senator Luedtke, are you ready to take up the consideration of LB 518 on general file? Very good. Clerk will read the bill.

CLERK: Legislative Bill 518. (read). There are no committee amendments.

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Luedtke.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Mr. President, I move that LB 518 be advanced to E&R for review. Mr. Chairman and Mem--Mr. President and Members of the Legislature. LB 518 is actually a bill that was brought in by the Bar Association to take care of a matter which was inadvertently omitted when some legislation was passed affecting Section 9-401, I think it was the last session of the year or the session before and the correctional matter merely clarifies where a mortgage on real estate concern would be filed or recorded. It is basically understood that it would be in the county where the real estate is but it didn't specifically say so and LB 518 spells that out.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion of the bill? Does that conclude your explanation, Senator Luedtke?

SENATOR LUEDTKE: That's it.

PRESIDENT: Very good. Any further discussion of the bill? Question is shall LB 518 be advanced from general file to E&R initial? All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote no. Voting on the advancement of LB 518 as explained by Senator Luedtke from general file. Clerk will record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, no nays.

PRESIDENT: Okay, the bill is advanced.
