what Senator Kelly said, I'm not sure that his comments would fit the discussion occurring on this bill, this bill is not designed to exclude elderly people from the population as a whole, it is designed to include them in an area where everybody already, everybody else is already found, because of Senator Barnett's astute pointing out of the fact that all of the population of Nebraska is to be covered and considered in the programing, he has hit the key, he has turned the key, he hit the nail on the head, this bill is not necessary in it's present form, but I think it serves a worthwhile purpose and a resolution or some directive from the legislature should go to ETV and let them know that the elderly have been neglected or felt that they have been and something should be done as far as programing is concerned, and if at that point ETV could not find it in their budget or their programing time to include some programing for the elderly, then I think a bill like this might be shown to be necessary, but to sum the whole thing up in a nut shell, I support Senator Snyder's kill motion. I want him to mark this well.

PRESIDENT: Senator Marsh, then Senator Cavanaugh.

SENATOR MARSH: I would like to, Mr. President I would like to inform the body that last year, educational television had a series of programs designed specifically for the aging for those 65 years of age and older, of which I did a research project, so I would support Senator Snyder's motion at this time, call for the question.

PRESIDENT: The question has been called for, does the Chair see five hands? The question is shall the debate now close, all those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote no. Previous question has been called. The question is shall the debate now close, thank you, the Clerk will record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, no nays to cease debate.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries, back to Senator Snyder on his motion to indefinitely postpone LB 525. Senator Snyder is closing.

SENATOR SNYDER: Mr. President, and members of the body, this can be exceedingly brief I'm sure because I think that the legislature is one now conducive to postponing this bill and I hope that we will always look at this type of legislation with the dangers that are written into this type of a bill. One point thought that I'd have to disagree with, although I do accept your support Senator Chambers, I have to disagree that airways are of the people. Not to get on this thing, but some day I may want to give a speech on it, but only to say that when you have a million dollar investment in a business you can over regulate also, but on this issue let's keep it separate and above that point. Mr. President that is enough said, I move for the postponement of LB 525.

PRESIDENT: The question is shall LB 525 be indefinitely postponed, all those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote no. The motion is to indefinitely postpone LB 525. Once again have you all voted? The Clerk will record.

CLERK: 24 ayes, 9 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The bill is indefinitely postponed, move onto the general file consideration of LB 131, excuse me Senator Snyder is there a motion on 131?

SENATOR SNYDER: Mr. President we are working on the amendments, I would ask unanimous consent to have it bracketed for tomorrow.

PRESIDENT: Senator Snyder asking unanimous consent to bracket
