(Start Belt #1)

PRESIDENT: (mike off)--come to order. We'll have prayer by the Chaplain.

CHAPLAIN: Prayer given.

PRESIDENT: Roll call.

CLERK: Senator Barnett asked to be excused until he arrives, Mr. President. Oh, Senator Barnett is present. Senator Cal Carsten asked to be excused from 11:00 to 12:00 today.

PRESIDENT: Are there objections to the absence? Hearing none, so ordered. Well, the objections weren't too loud at least. Have you all indicated your presence? Clerk will record.

CLERK: Senator Keyes asked to be excused, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Are there objections to Senator Keyes' absence?

CLERK: Quorum present, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Any corrections for the Journal?

CLERK: Yes, Mr. President; (read). That's all Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Are there additional corrections from the floor? If not the Journal will stand as corrected. Do we have any notices of committee hearings or reports?

CLERK: Mr. President (communication read) (committee reports)

PRESIDENT: No other committee hearings? Thank you. One, two, three, four, five, six bills on final reading this morning, beginning with LB 277. Chair recognizes Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Personal privilege.

PRESIDENT: State your point, Senator.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Between now and the time we get through with final reading, I hope the Chair will read up on lobbyists and their registration because they're going to bring up a point of order.

PRESIDENT: Yes sir. Thank you. Final reading this morning as soon as we clear the floor, get the Senators in their seats we'll begin with LB 277. The Chair does hate to call to the attention of the Senators, that means that all of the Senators will have to be in their seats if we're going on final reading. Those are the rules of the Legislature. Will the Sergeant at Arms remind Senator Marvel over there please, that we're waiting to go on final reading? Would a page bring me a worksheet, please? Attention please, final reading of LB 277. The Clerk will read the bill.

CLERK: Engross Legislative Bill 277. Introduced by Cal Carsten of the 2nd district (read)

PRESIDENT: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall the bill pass? All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote no. Once again have you all voted? Clerk will record.

CLERK: Roll call vote read. 41 ayes, no nays, 8 not voting.
