PRESIDENT: Now is there any further discussion of 449 as amended? All right, Senator Johnson is now closing on 449. Senator Johnson.

SENATOR JOHNSON: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I move that LB 449 be advanced to E & R for Initial and, I think that it's been discussed a-plenty. I'll simply say that I hope that we get 25 votes to advance it and those that do vote to advance it may be doing more for the dental health of the people in Nebraska than the 10 best dentists can in a lifetime, so I renew my motion to advance.

PRESIDENT: Question is, shall LB 449 as amended now be advanced from General File to E & R Initial? All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote no.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 9nays, 9 not voting.

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced. That brings up for General File debate--looks to me like next on General File is 449A.

CLERK: Reads title. There are no amendments.

PRESIDENT: Senator Johnson, what is your pleasure regarding 449A?

SENATOR JOHNSON: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I move that we move 449A to E & R for Initial.

PRESIDENT: Question is, shall LB 449A be advanced from General File to E & R Initial? All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote no. Voting on the advancement of LB 449A from General File. Have you all voted? Clerk will record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, no nays, 23 not voting.

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced. Brings up LB 131 for General File debate.

CLERK: Reads title. There are committee amendments by Senator Waldron's Miscellaneous Subjects Committee.

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Snyder.

SENATOR SNYDER: Mr. President, due to the, to the gentlemen who left for Washington this morning and their roll in this bill, I would ask that the bill be bracketed for one week.

PRESIDENT: Senator Snyder asking unanimous consent to bracket 131 for one week, it will be heard a week from today. Are there objections to bracketing the bill for a week? Hearing no objections, it is so ordered. The bill is bracketed. That does then bring us around to LB 540 and 541. It was given unanimous consent by, on Senator Carpenter's request this morning.

CLERK: Reads title. There are committee amendments by Senator Cavanaugh, it's signed, Chairman of the Miscellaneous Subjects Committee.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I move the committee amendments be adopted. What the committee amendments does, it's corrective language except the one area which it limits the rate of interest that
