SENATOR WHITNEY: Okay, I have no objections to Senator Carpenter's amendment.

SPEAKER: Well, if you have no objections to his amendment then that's what we will vote on. Senator Marsh and then Senator Schmidt.

SENATOR MARSH: I have a personal objection since I have a 7:30 to 8:30 commitment tomorrow.

SPEAKER: Well, Senator, rather than get this all bolixed up, I think that however we vote is going to be the way it is if one of them fails then we will go to the other one so I will take Senator Carpenter's amendment. Senator Schmidt.

SENATOR SCHMIDT: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, the Committee on Agriculture and Environment has scheduled for tomorrow morning at 8:00 a public hearing on LB 535 so the five members of the Ag Committee would not be here for that period of time, if it makes any difference, you should have that information.

SPEAKER: Senator Snyder.

SENATOR SNYDER: Mr. President, I'm not accustomed to speaking for the Legislative Ladies League but it seems to me that there's a dinner that is scheduled for 12:30 tomorrow. I don't know how many are planning to attend but that just came to my mind and I thought I'd throw it out.

SPEAKER: Senator Syas.

SENATOR SYAS: Well, normally, I would like Senator Carpenter's idea and I still like it other than the fact is that if you can see fit to carry on without the Constitutional Revisions Committee until 2:00 why I suppose it is acceptable because, this, we have at 12:45 starting, we have two bills to hear public hearing on Constitutional Revision and Recreation so we couldn't be back any earlier than 2:00. I set it at 12:45 so we--I figured we could cover both bills in that length of time but I intended to put a time limit on testimony. So regardless of what you do, you'd have to do without us until 2:00 and that's 7 of us.

SPEAKER: Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: I was just going to mention, Mr. President, for consideration, I believe the Nebraska Press Association is Friday and Saturday and I assume some members may be staying over for Friday noon in any event because their local editors and so forth, I think, I assume they've contacted you. Now that doesn't mean we have to meet, but I was just reminding them of that invitation.

SPEAKER: Senator Waldron, were you asking the floor?

SENATOR WALDRON: Mr. President, I'd like to remind the body that the Miscellaneous Subjects Committee meets tomorrow at public hearing at 1:00.

SPEAKER: Senator Carpenter, do you want to change your times any on that motion?

SENATOR CARPENTER: Yes, I move that when we--I'd just as soon be here Friday and I hope only 25 or 26 of you are here. That's the kind of day I like to operate in. So I move my friends that when we recess, when we adjourn today we adjourn at the regular time and when we adjourn on Thursday afternoon we adjourn until Monday at 10:00 a.m. If you don't want this,
