Clerk reading.

SPEAKER: At this time the Chair would like to recognize in the North Balcony 42 High School students from Fairmont. They are in Senator Maresh's district. We're glad to have you here and we welcome you to the Palace of Justice. Anything further on the Clerk's desk?

CLERK: Nothing, Mr. President.

SPEAKER: Now I did prepare or I should say Dr. Rogers prepared, rather hurriedly a list of so-called non controversial bills. That was our order of procedure unless somebody wants to change it. I hope not because we'll probably spend a half hour discussing it, but we'll proceed on the non controversial list. However, two or three Senators have told me that they have non controversial bills and I'm going to trust them to that extent. If any of these bills become controversial in any degree, the Chair is going to rule that we pass over them. Now I'll recognize Senators at this time who believe they have non controversial bills. Senator Luedtke.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Yes, Mr. President, I would ask unanimous consent to add LB 338 which was the bill concerning mileage for State and County officials and which had no opposition and was unanimously voted out by the committee.

SPEAKER: Alright, that's LB 33--

CLERK: 338.

SPEAKER: 338. Will you please just add--put that on the bottom of your list? Now, Senator Kremer.

SENATOR KREMER: Mr. Chairman. Not related to this, but before we take--go into general file discussion, the reprint of LB 45 that was heard by the Public Works Committee and reviewed and also extensively, was amended, is now reprinted and ready to go. It's over here on the side of the room and we will have the pages distribute these. I'm saying this because I think every Senator ought to have a chance to review this bill or look over it for a period of time. It has to do with penalties, the rules of the road, many changes are made. So having said that I would be hopeful that every Senator would look over this bill because it's a long, long bill and now Senator Barnett who is the, the subcommittee chairman that had to do with studying this bill during the interim, probably will have some comments to make at this time, not lengthy but also suggest that maybe we ought to bracket this bill for a certain date and he could have his choice from that end, his bill, but I just want to announce that this bill will be laid on your desks, take good care of it and look over it. It does have an index and it does say what's in the bill. It's pretty important. I think we ought to have a good look at it.

SPEAKER: Thank you Senator. Senator Barnett, I'll come right back to you but, let's get this non controversial list finished and, and please don't try to sneak something through. This isn't the time or the place to do that. If you've got a valid non controversial bill, let's get rid of it today and, and you don't have to explain it, just give me the number and we'll add it to the list. Senator Keyes.

SENATOR KEYES: I don't think there's any opposition to 340 and I'd like to get it--
